FIRE REVIEW COMMITTEE MINUTES

The meeting was called to order at 7:10 a.m. by Chair Rich Nilles

ROLL CALL:

MINUTES: Mike Olberding asked the staff for a clarification on the Uniform Fire Code requirements for commercial fire inspections. He asked for clarification on whether these inspections must take place and if they must be annual. He didn't feel that the committee had a clear understanding regarding the necessity of the annual inspection. Ben Erb responded that he will review the Uniform Fire Code and respond back to the committee.

MOTION: Alexander/Gunn moved to approve the minutes of the February 6, 1992 meeting. <u>Vote on the Motion:</u> Carried unanimously by those present.

OPEN MEETINGS LAW: Kathy Tri requested from the City Attorney information regarding the requirements of the Open Meetings Law. She gave this information to Fred Casey who had requested it.

FIRE FEE DISCUSSION:

Leonard Johnson indicated that the \$11,000 collected by the City for the Fire Inspection Fee is a drop in the bucket in the City's budget. He felt that if Chief Christensen needs more help, the City should give it to him. He understands that the Fire and Police Departments do need the information on all businesses for emergencies and that this information needs to be kept up to date. George Alexander felt that the City should insure that this money goes to the Fire Department to help them. Mike Gunn proposed that the money that the City has collected be given to the Fire Department and that the inspection fee be repealed. In the following discussion, the committee members talked about those businesses who have not paid the fee and how the Fire Department would keep current information on existing businesses within the

community. Ben Erb indicated that the fire fee inspection forms have helped the department create a list of businesses and that the data is better than what they had, but it is hard to keep current. Leonard Johnson indicated that they could use the money collected from this fee to keep the information current. He also expressed that he opposed the selling of these lists.

MOTION: Gunn/Johnson moved to recommend to the City Council that the funds collected from the Fire Inspection Fee be given to the Fire Department, and that the Fire Inspection Fee be repealed. The motion was amended to add (1) that for those businesses which have not paid the annual Fire Inspection Fee the City collect only \$25.00 per business and that that money also go the Fire Department and (2) that those businesses in the Rural Fire District and, all other businesses, including, home occupations be included. Vote on the Motion: Carried unanimously by those present.

Fred Casey clarified that the motion includes repealing the existing ordinance, that all funds go to the Fire Department, and for those that have not paid a one time \$25.00 registration fee be imposed and that the City should try to collect that fee. Committee members concurred.

Rich Nilles then directed the discussion to other possibilities to recommend to the Council. These included a one time registration fee to keep police and fire informed of all businesses within the community, dealing with "tent campers" and other transient merchants, and a public safety levy. The committee discussed various ideas related to these suggestions.

MOTION: Olberding/Gunn moved to recommend to the City Council that the City Council enact an ordinance placing a \$250 per month registration fee on sidewalk vendors, other temporary vendors and transient vendors with a \$500 fine if they do not obtain a license and that all local non-profit groups be excluded from this registration requirement.

The committee discussed this motion and its effect on various groups within the community, including the effect on the Old Fashioned Days. Mike Olberding expressed that we need to recognize that there is a problem within the community with these merchants and that we need to do something about them. <u>Vote on the Motion</u>: Carried unanimously by those present.

Finally, the committee discussed having a business registration fee to assist the Fire and Police Departments in keeping current information for emergency purposes.

MOTION: Olberding/Johnson moved to recommend to the City Council that it keep a \$25.00 business registration fee for new businesses only. <u>Vote on the Motion:</u> Carried unanimously by those present.

ADJOURNMENT: The Committee adjourned at 8:15 a.m.

Chair Rich Nilles reviewed Duane Cole's memorandum to the Committee outlining the Committee's charge.

Fred Casey asked for an opinion from the City Attorney regarding the status of this committee and the requirements of the Open Meetings Law. He questioned if a group of businessmen could get together to make a recommendation to the Council. Kathy Tri indicated that she would get a written opinion from the City Attorney. She also indicated that a group of businessmen could make a recommendation to the Council but it would not be part of this Committee's actions. Any action by this Committee must be held under the Open Meetings Law.

The Committee generally agreed that it had no problem with the City collecting information about businesses within the community. They agreed that it was important for the Fire and Police Departments to have information on each business owner, the type of business, the address, emergency phone numbers and the number of employees. However, most of the Committee agreed that they objected to the self-inspection form. They also expressed a concern that the money collected from the Fire Inspection Fee was not directly benefitting the Fire Department. Committee members expressed a concern about their lack of expertise in completing a self-inspection form. Mike Gunn asked the staff if the City Attorney had issued a legal opinion on the self-inspection form prior to its being sent out. Elmer Christensen responded that no, Terry Mahr did not give a formal opinion. However, he felt that there was

no more liability to a business in completing the form than if the Fire Department did an inspection, missed something and a fire occurred. The insurance company would still cover the loss. Mike Gunn reiterated that he still felt there was potentiality for the insurance company to deny that claim. Chief Christensen also explained who received the self-inspection form and that it was only about 140 businesses of the 440 who were billed. Dennis Lewis expressed that he felt the form was a good housekeeping measure. It has made businesses aware of potential problems.

MOTION: Gene Davis/Leonard Johnson moved to eliminate the single inspection form and to destroy the information received by the City on the self-inspection form, except for the names, addresses, and emergency phone numbers. <u>Vote on the Motion:</u> Carried unanimously by those present.

The Committee then turned its discussion towards how the City could find additional funds to add an employee to the Fire Department. They expressed an interest in reviewing the City's General Fund budget to see where they might be able to recommend where the City could find additional funds. Fred Casey felt that some of the 1992-93 increase in the City's tax base could cover the necessary funding for an additional firefighter. Dave Ryan asked if the interest from the Economic Development Revolving Loan Fund could pay for an inspector. George Alexander expressed an interest that instead of having a fire inspection fee to have business license. Fred Casey suggested that some of the Committee members get together and put together some ideas to be presented to the Committee at its next meeting.

Mike Olberding asked Chief Christensen about woodstove inspections, home occupations, and inspections in the Rural Fire District. Chief Christensen indicated that the law does not allow the Fire Department to enter private residences unless they are asked. The commercial inspections are required under the Uniform Fire Code. He also indicated that the Fire Inspector does a number of other jobs other than fire inspections; these include firefighting and rescue.

The Committee agreed to reconvene in a couple of weeks.

ADJOURNMENT: The Committee adjourned at 8:10 a.m.
