Hi Martina,

I was looking through City of Molalla's data in NetDMR and I noticed that their reported temperatures are really, really high (over 100 deg C- in winter- for some submissions). However, when examining their submitted DMRs the values are much lower (in the 10 deg C range). It looks like someone may have mistyped something, but they've done it for multiple CORs. They also appear to be recent submitters. What is the process for reaching out to a permittee and either correcting old data that is incorrect or letting them know to be more careful in the future? Does the request go through the compliance inspector?
