POSITION SUMMARY:

This position is funded through Oregon Health Authority and then assigned to the Public Health Division. Through the Public Health Division are Alcohol and Drug Prevention Education Program (ADPEP) and Tobacco Prevention and Education Program (TPEP). This program will be administered by the Curry County Juvenile Department.

This position will coordinate strategies designed to promote health and prevent substance use, misuse, disorder and addiction and associated effects across the life span. They will work to reduce risk factors and increase protective factors associated with alcohol, tobacco, and other drugs in Curry County.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

Alcohol and Drug Prevention Education Program (ADPEP)

- 1. Is the Point of Information for Curry County Prevention Fentanyl and Opioid campaign. Gathers accurate information, market strategies and data, educates community and understands the crisis.
- 2. Coordinates an Alcohol and Drug Prevention Education Program (ADPEP) and Tobacco Prevention Education Program (TPEP) plan among state and community partners. The plan will focus on: reducing health disparities in our county and state, engages organizations and communities in prevention, develops partnerships that improve the health of all Oregonians, addresses the leading causes of death and disability, addresses the risk factors which lead to chronic disease and substance use disorder or dependence, uses data for decision making, setting priorities and defining and tracking health outcomes and plan and implement evidence-based interventions.
- 3. Fulfills grant responsibilities: eLearning Modules, in person or webinar trainings, community practice sessions, regional support networking, attends grantee/contractor meetings, and attends annual conference. Submits quarterly and annual reporting as required by the funders.

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ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES: (cont.)

4. Works with Law Enforcement Agencies to gather and share drug related statistics, trends and concerns.
