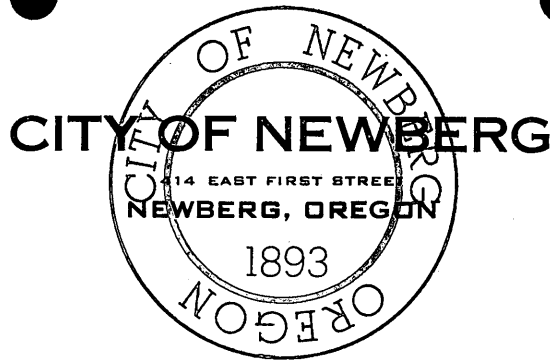

Gentlemen:

The attached application covering the request for a planning loan will cover areas both within the City of Newberg and areas adjacent to the City.

Recent developments in this area has created a need for this type of study:

1. Annexation of approximately 200 acres last year. Apartments, trailer court and other buildings are planned for this area in the near future. At present no sewer lines in this area, and only one small water line.
2. Annexation of approximately 400 acres will probably consummate within next two or three months. 40% of this area now has houses. Also includes new high school and grade school. Small private water lines in this area, and only existing sewage line serves the schools.
3. Spaulding Division of the Publishers Paper Company has recently announced a \$27,500,000.00 expansion program to be completed by 1967. Sewage and water developments will be urgently needed to take care of the influx of families and housing for the additional employees of this plant.
4. Present sewage treatment plant and interceptor lines are operating near capacity in winter months.
5. Water facilities are near capacity in summer months, and due to the large content of iron in present well water supply the treatment facilities are inadequate.

We respectfully request your early consideration for the loan to cover the engineering services we have outlined in the accompanying application.

Dear Mr. Gilbert:

Please refer to my letter of May 15, 1974 advising you of approval of your request for reimbursement under Section 206(a) of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act Amendments of 1972. That letter established your reimbursement entitlement at \$150,746 and authorized a grant payment of \$75,400, fifty percent of the entitlement rounded to the nearest hundred. You have subsequently received that payment.

As a result of an audit of the project records, the eligible cost of the project has been revised to \$753,191. Your reimbursement entitlement is \$150,477, which is 50 percent of the revised eligible cost less \$226,119 already paid on the non-reimbursement grant.

A complete national assessment of total claims for reimbursement has now been made and each grantee's share of available appropriations has been set at 68.709 percent of its entitlement.

Enclosed is a completed EPA Form 5700-34 which increases your reimbursement by \$27,900, from \$75,400 to \$103,300. The latter figure is 68.709 percent of your entitlement, rounded downward to the nearest hundred. Payment has been authorized and you should receive a check for \$27,900 shortly.

Further reimbursement payments will be subject to additional appropriations being made by Congress.

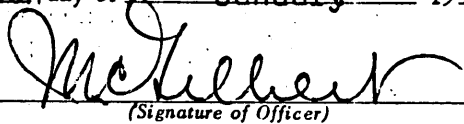

RESOLUTION

Authorizing filing of application with the United States of America for an advance to provide for the planning of public works under the terms of Public Law 560, 83rd Congress of the United States, as amended.

WHEREAS, the City of Newberg, Oregon (herein called the "Applicant") after
(Legal name of applicant)

thorough consideration of the various aspects of the problem and study of available data has hereby determined that the construction of certain public works, generally described as construction of new water supply from additional wells or intake construction from the Willamette River, the expansion of the existing water treatment facilities, and additions to the existing water distribution system. Also to include new interceptor sewer lines and to provide for the construction of sewage treatment facilities to treat wastes from the new interceptor. is desirable and in the public interest and to that end it is necessary that action preliminary to the construction of said works be taken immediately; and

WHEREAS, under the terms of Public Law 560, 83rd Congress, as amended, the United States of America has authorized the making of advances to public bodies to aid in financing the cost of engineering and architectural surveys, designs, plans, working drawings, specifications or other action preliminary to and in preparation for the construction of public works; and

WHEREAS, the applicant has examined and duly considered such act and the applicant considers it to be in the public interest and to its benefit to file an application under said act and to authorize other action in connection therewith;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY the Council of the City of Newberg, Oregon, the governing body of said applicant, as follows:

1. That the construction of said public works is essential to and is to the best interests of the applicant, and to the end that such public works may be provided as promptly as practicable it is desirable that action preliminary to the construction thereof be undertaken immediately;
2. That M.C. Gilbert, Finance Officer for the City of Newberg, Oregon be hereby authorized to file in behalf of the applicant an application (in form required by the United States and in conformity with said act) for an advance to be made by the United States to the applicant to aid in defraying the cost of plan preparation for the above described public works, which shall consist generally of construction of new water supply from additional wells or intake construction from the Willamette River and expansion of water treatment facilities and to include new sewer lines and construction of sewage treatment facilities.
3. That if such advance be made, the applicant shall provide or make necessary arrangements to provide such funds, in addition to the advance, as may be required to defray the cost of the plan preparation of such public works;
4. The said M.C. Gilbert, is hereby authorized to furnish such information and take such action as may be necessary to enable the applicant to qualify for the advance;
5. That the officer designated in the preceding paragraph is hereby designated as the authorized representative of the applicant for the purpose of furnishing to the United States such information, data, and documents pertaining to the application for an advance as may be required; and otherwise to act as the authorized representative of the applicant in connection with this application.
6. That certified copies of this resolution be included as part of the application for an advance to be submitted to the United States.

EXHIBIT "B"

PROPOSED PUBLIC WORKS DESCRIPTION OF PUBLIC WORKS

The proposed public works shall provide for the construction of a new water supply from additional wells or intake construction from the Willamette River, the expansion of the existing water treatment facilities, and additions to the existing water distribution system.

The proposed public works will also include a new interceptor sewer to be located near Hess Creek and lateral sewers leading to the new interceptor, thereby providing sewer service to a partially developed area which has petitioned for annexation to the City. It would also provide for the construction of sewage treatment facilities to treat the wastes from the new interceptor.

In order to properly size the proposed water and sewerage facilities to serve the proposed annexation area, it is essential that the preliminary planning be extended to cover the entire study area as indicated in Exhibit "A" attached.

EXHIBIT "C"

DESCRIPTION OF PUBLIC NEED FOR PROPOSED PUBLIC WORKS

WATER SYSTEM

Description of public need for proposed public work:

The maximum capacity of the City's existing water-producing facilities is approximately 4.65 mgd (million gallons per day). In four of the last five years, the water demands in the service area would have exceeded the supply had the City not curtailed water consumption by restricting irrigation, car washing, and other nonessential uses of water.

Approximately 85 percent of the City's water supply comes from vertical wells. The water has a very high natural iron concentration necessitating iron removal facilities. These present treatment facilities produce a marginally satisfactory water and are not capable of satisfactorily treating the water from an expanded source.

SEWERAGE FACILITIES

The clay soil throughout the study area is such that septic tank disposal systems are not practical.

There is also a fruit and vegetable processing plant located within the study area which requires waste treatment facilities for their process wastes.

It is essential that the community extend their water and sewerage facilities to this partially developed area in order to protect the health of the community.

R E S O L U T I O N

WHEREAS, the City of Newberg, in Yamhill County, Oregon, has determined that the construction of water system and the extension of the area served by said system is desirable and in the public interest; and

WHEREAS, said City of Newberg has filed an application with the United States of America for an advance to provide for the planning of such public works under the terms of Public Law 560, 83rd Congress of the United States of America, as amended; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Newberg contemplates the receipt of federal money to be used in the planning to determine the feasibility of the contemplated public works; and

WHEREAS, the obligation to repay such money to the federal government is contingent upon whether or not actual physical construction of the within mentioned facilities is commenced, or contract therefor is entered into; and

WHEREAS, the area into which said water system is to be extended lies largely outside the present city limits of the City of Newberg; and,

WHEREAS, said area may not be regularly annexed to the said city by the time said public works are constructed; and,

WHEREAS, doubt exists as to the power or willingness of said city to finance the construction of such public works in areas outside the limits of said city:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COURT OF YAMHILL COUNTY, OREGON, as follows:

That Yamhill County will cooperate with the City of Newberg in the planning of the public works herein referred to, and in the event that the area encompassed in such plan shall not be annexed to the City of Newberg by the time such planning is complete, and in the event the County shall thereafter elect, pursuant to any authority which it may at such time have, to proceed with the construction of the public water works, or any portion thereof, pursuant to the plans adopted by the City of Newberg for the improvement and extension of its water system, then and in that event the County agrees to repay to the federal government the amount of the funds expended by the federal government for the purpose of the plans and surveys for such water system to the extent said funds expended are attributable to that portion of the said water system constructed by the County.
