

Each certificate enclosed confirms the water right established under the terms of a permit or transfer order issued by this department. The water right is now appurtenant to the specific place where the use was established as described by the certificate. The owner of the land is the owner of the water right. Oregon law does not allow the Director to reissue a certificate because of a change in the ownership.

The water right is limited to a specific amount of water, but not more than can be beneficially used for the purposes stated within the certificate. The water must be controlled and not wasted. To change the location of the point of diversion, the character of use, or the location of use requires the advance approval of the Water Resources Director.

If any portion of this water right is not used for five or more consecutive years, that portion would be forfeited by the nonuse. However, land enrolled in a Federal Reserve Program is not subject to forfeiture during the period of enrollment. A water right may also be forfeited by any intentional act by the owner that would cause the water right to be unusable. For example, the land irrigated under the water right is made nonirrigable by covering it with pavement or buildings.

confirms the right to use the waters of WELL #5 in the WILLAMETTE RIVER BASIN for MUNICIPAL USE.

This right was perfected under Permit G-5277. The date of priority is AUGUST 6, 1970. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 3.0 CUBIC FOOT PER SECOND, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The well is located as follows:

This certificate is issued to confirm a change in POINT OF APPROPRIATION approved by an order of the Water Resources Director entered OCTOBER 28, 1980, and supersedes Certificate 48101, State Record of Water Right Certificates.

The issuance of this superseding certificate does not confirm the status of the water right in regard to the provisions of ORS 540.610 pertaining to forfeiture or abandonment.

The following provisions shall be effective when in the judgment of the Watermaster it becomes necessary to install headgates and measuring devices:

the diversion works shall include an in-line flow meter, a weir, or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the wateruser is entitled;

the type and plans of the measuring device be approved by the Watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said Watermaster.

The well shall be maintained in accordance with the General Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells in Oregon.

The right to use water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.
