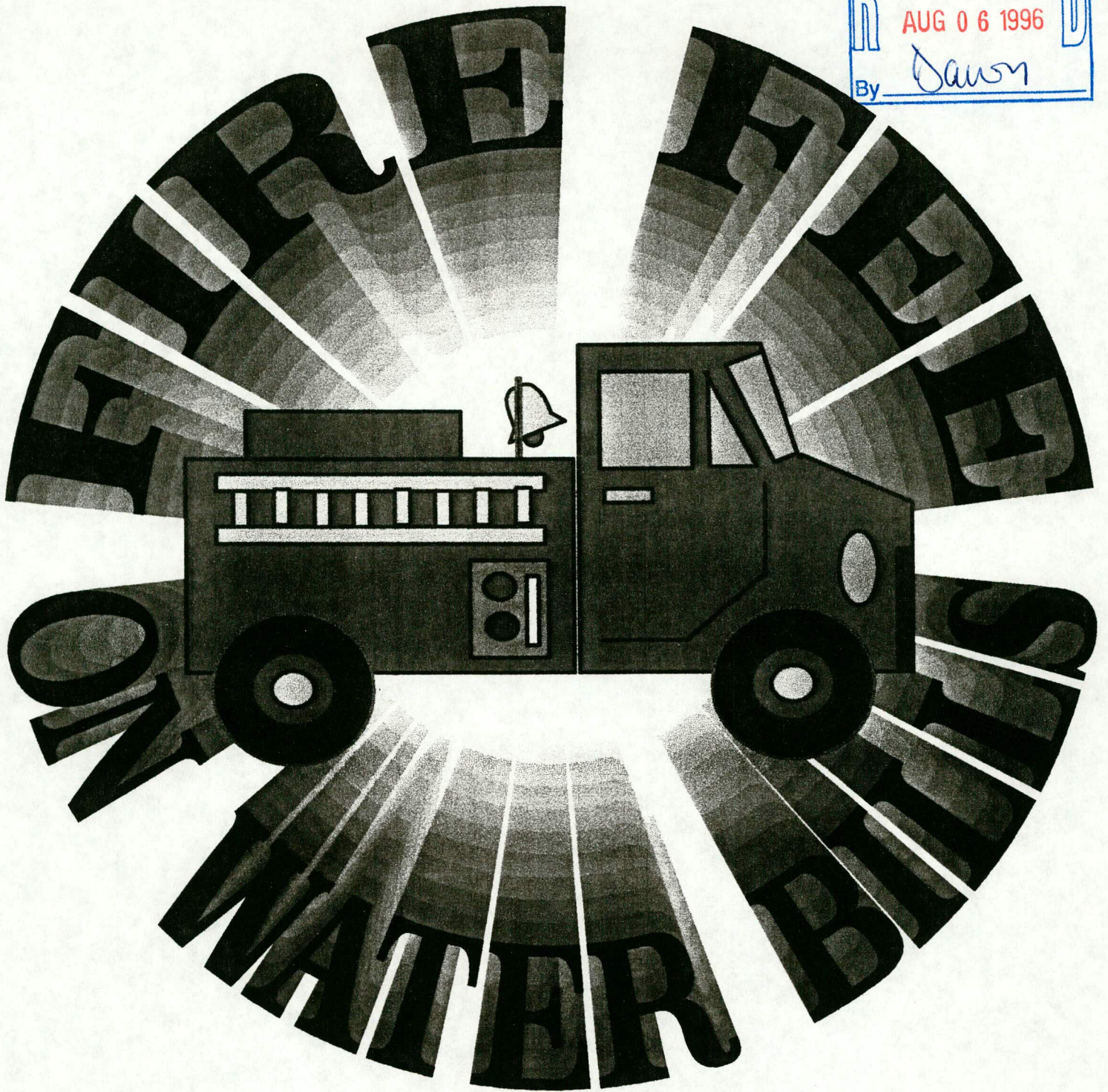
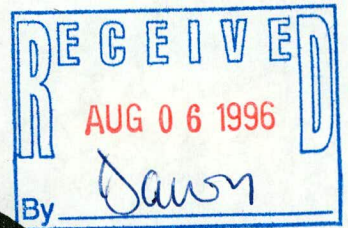




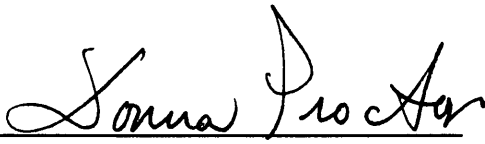

Fire Fee on Water Bills

In 1991 the City of Newberg needed to replace a 25 year old fire truck. After exploring different funding options, the City received voter approval to implement a fee of \$1.00 per meter equivalent per month in order to raise the needed \$163,000. The fee was billed to residents on the City's monthly utility bill. The money raised by the fee was dedicated to the purchase of a fully equipped fire engine that the City initially projected would take four (4) years to raise. However, sufficient funds were raised within three (3) years and the fee was removed one year prior to what the City promised the voters. The voters supported this measure despite Measure 5's passage and general discontent with property taxes.

In 1995 the City completed a 10 year Fire Department Strategic Plan. Fire equipment and a substation were identified as immediate needs of the department. Staff immediately began to consider ways to fund the purchase of almost \$1.2 million in needed fire apparatus, including fire engines, ladder truck and support vehicles. Options included a bond levy, a lease-purchase arrangement or re-enactment of the fire fee. Property taxes were considered the first choice since a bond is simple to request, but staff felt that the voters would not approve a bond issue. A major consideration was also the fact that some of the City's biggest fire department users were non-property taxpaying institutions -- George Fox University, Newberg School District, Chehalem Park District and other non-profits. The lease-purchase option was considered but staff determined that General Fund resources were insufficient to cover the needed annual costs. That brought the staff and City Council back to the fire fee.

In a 1995 City survey, respondents indicated by a margin of 79% that they were willing to finance the purchase of fire equipment with a fee similar to the one enacted earlier. After

some discussion and recommendation by the Finance Committee of the Council about how much the fee should be and for how long should it be in place, the City Council put a measure on the May 21, 1996 ballot asking for voter approval of a \$1.50 meter equivalent fire fee to help finance \$1.2 million in needed fire equipment over a period of eight (8) years. The City's General Fund will be contributing to the Fire Truck Fund and the City hopes to get a donation from a major industry.

The fire fee was approved by the voters and went into effect July 1, 1996. The first billing was included on the July utility bills and produced approximately \$8,100 in revenue as projected. The only cost to implementing the program has been related to computer programming, which has been minimal. The staff does get quite a few questions about their bills, but when they explain the \$1.50 fee, customers tend to be very accepting.

Fire equipment costs a lot of money. Few cities reserve enough funds, if any, for future purchase of fire equipment. The Newberg City Council and staff feel this is a reasonable program with broad public acceptance. It has been easy to administer. The products are visible assets of the community and benefit everyone. This has been an innovative program which could be implemented in other cities.

RESOLUTION NO. 96-1948

A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING A FIRE FEE FOR THE PURPOSE OF REPLACING EXISTING ROLLING STOCK AND RESCUE EQUIPMENT IN THE NEWBERG FIRE DEPARTMENT

RECITALS:

1. The Newberg Fire Department needs to keep replacing its existing rolling stock and rescue equipment owned by the City; and
2. The City Council has determined that it is in the best interest to attach a fee to in-City customer utility bills as an efficient way to collect sufficient funds; and
3. Between January 1991 and December 1993 the City implemented a similar financing scheme for replacing a fire truck;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Newberg, Oregon, as follows:

Section 1. Fee Schedule. Effective July 1, 1996 a charge per residential meter equivalent shall be included on the monthly utility bill for all in-city customers. The fee schedule shall be:

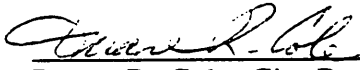

Section 2. Exemptions. Irrigation and non-city utility users will not be charged the fire truck fee.

Section 3. Delinquency. Failure to pay the fire fee will constitute a delinquency in the customer's utility bill. The current regulations for payment of delinquent utility bills and for shutting off water service shall apply.

Section 4. Biennial Review. The Finance Committee of the City Council and the staff shall review the fee, revenues generated and Fire Departments needs every two years and will report back to the City Council with its recommendation.

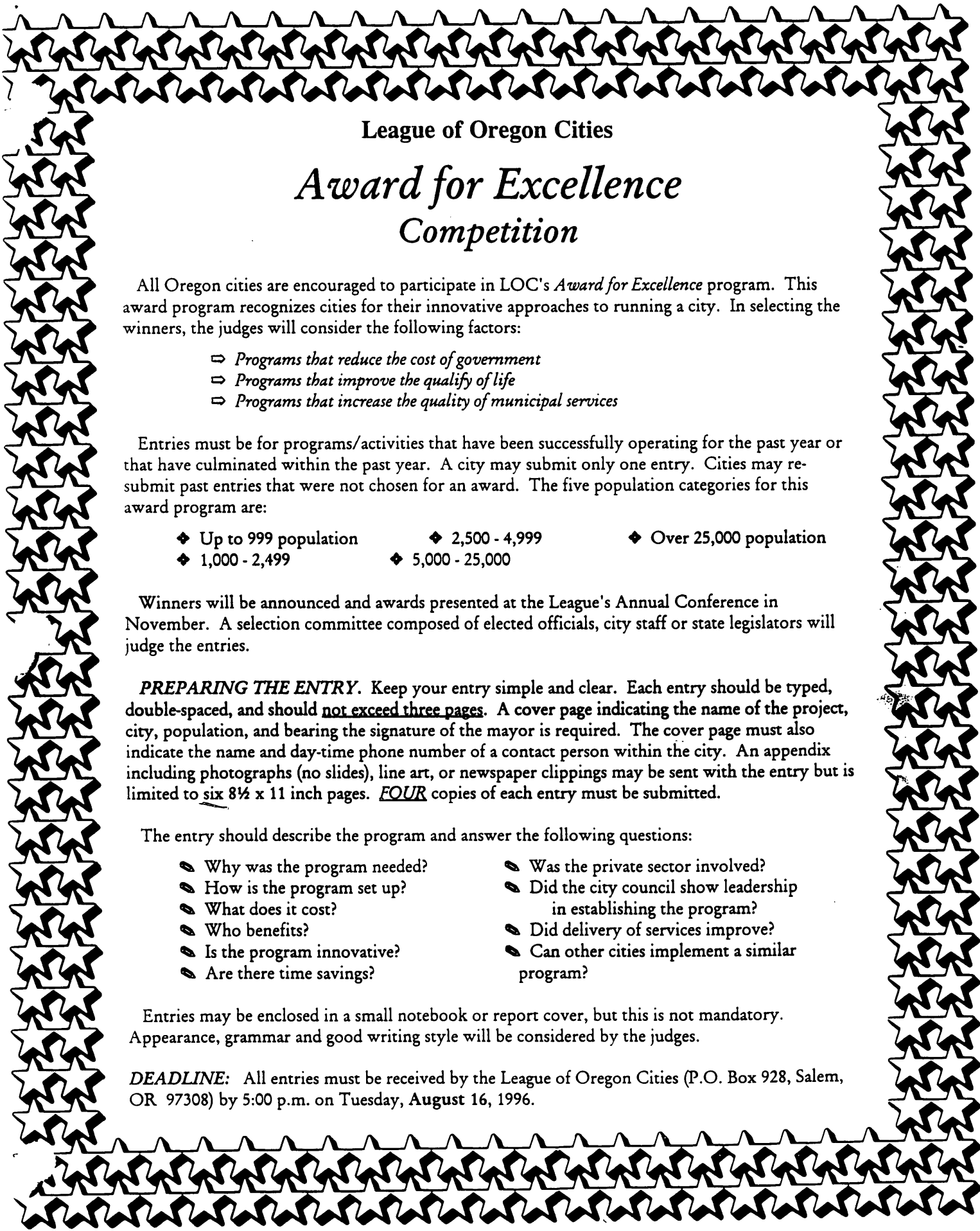

League of Oregon Cities

Award for Excellence Competition

All Oregon cities are encouraged to participate in LOC's *Award for Excellence* program. This award program recognizes cities for their innovative approaches to running a city. In selecting the winners, the judges will consider the following factors:

- ⇒ *Programs that reduce the cost of government*
- ⇒ *Programs that improve the quality of life*
- ⇒ *Programs that increase the quality of municipal services*

Entries must be for programs/activities that have been successfully operating for the past year or that have culminated within the past year. A city may submit only one entry. Cities may re-submit past entries that were not chosen for an award. The five population categories for this award program are:

- ◆ Up to 999 population
- ◆ 1,000 - 2,499
- ◆ 2,500 - 4,999
- ◆ 5,000 - 25,000
- ◆ Over 25,000 population

Winners will be announced and awards presented at the League's Annual Conference in November. A selection committee composed of elected officials, city staff or state legislators will judge the entries.

PREPARING THE ENTRY. Keep your entry simple and clear. Each entry should be typed, double-spaced, and should not exceed three pages. A cover page indicating the name of the project, city, population, and bearing the signature of the mayor is required. The cover page must also indicate the name and day-time phone number of a contact person within the city. An appendix including photographs (no slides), line art, or newspaper clippings may be sent with the entry but is limited to six 8½ x 11 inch pages. FOUR copies of each entry must be submitted.

The entry should describe the program and answer the following questions:

- Why was the program needed?
- How is the program set up?
- What does it cost?
- Who benefits?
- Is the program innovative?
- Are there time savings?
- Was the private sector involved?
- Did the city council show leadership in establishing the program?
- Did delivery of services improve?
- Can other cities implement a similar program?

Entries may be enclosed in a small notebook or report cover, but this is not mandatory. Appearance, grammar and good writing style will be considered by the judges.

DEADLINE: All entries must be received by the League of Oregon Cities (P.O. Box 928, Salem, OR 97308) by 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, August 16, 1996.

RECITALS:

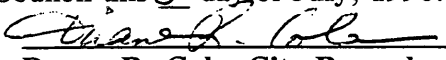
1. At the May 21, 1996 Primary Election, the City had on the ballot four measures. Said election was conducted through the County Clerk of Yamhill County, State of Oregon.
2. According to the certification of the ballots as provided to the City by Charles Stern, Yamhill County Clerk, the City Elections Officer canvassed the votes and the Mayor proclaimed the results on June 3, 1996. A copy of the Mayor's Proclamation is attached hereto as Exhibit "A".
3. Pursuant to the results presented, a recount of the votes cast in Ballot Measure No. 36-35 was held on June 11, 1996. The recount of this Ballot Measure is confirmed and a second recount on this Measure was not required.
4. The results of the recount for Ballot Measure No. 36-35 produced figures that were not consistent with the previous ballot count. In reviewing the issues with Charles Stern, it was recommended that the City Council request of the Secretary of State, a recount of the three remaining City ballot measures. A copy of Resolution No. 96-1977 is attached hereto as Exhibit "B".
5. On July 2, 1996, the Yamhill County Clerk conducted a recount of the three remaining City Measures (Measure Nos. 36-36, 36-37 and 36-38).
6. On July 2, 1996, the Canvass of Votes and Mayor's Proclamation for the June 11, 1996 and July 2, 1996 recount results were posted on July 3, 1996. A copy of the Proclamation and Canvass of Votes - Recounts held on June 11, 1996 and July 2, 1996 are attached hereto as Exhibit "C".
