Sealed bids for the construction of the Public Works Shop Remodel Project in the City of Newberg, Oregon addressed to the Community Development Director, 719 E. First St., Newberg, Oregon 97132, will be received by Community Development Director, until 2:00 p.m. prevailing time on the 21st day of April, 1999 at the Community Development Building, 719 E. First St., Newberg, Oregon at which time and place all bids will be opened and publicly read aloud by the undersigned or his designated representative.

The project generally consists of the removal of all walls, cabinets, garage door and plywood wall coverings in the area to be remodeled. Concrete floor to be removed and replaced as indicated on the drawings. Walls and ceiling joists to be constructed of the widths and depths indicated on the plans. Insulation to be installed in perimeter walls and ceilings; R-19 in 2x4 walls, R-21 in 2x6 walls. Installation of doors and windows as specified on the plans. All new walls and ceilings to be covered with 1/2" gypsum board, taped and textured. After final texture is applied to the walls and ceilings same shall be painted with a satin finish latex paint. Install vinyl floor covering with coved baseboards as indicated on the drawings. Install metal toilet compartment partitions and doors. Contractor or his subcontractor shall have designed and supply a heating/air conditioning system to be installed in the location provided for on the plans. Also vent fans in restrooms and attic ventilation fans in the roof structure. Install electrical switches, outlets and other electrical fixtures called for on the plans. Construct and install cabinets of the size indicated at specific points throughout the building.

Plans and Specifications may be obtained and examined at the office of the Community Development Director, 719 E. First St., Newberg, Oregon 97132.

No proposal will be received or considered unless the bid contains statements by the bidder as a part of his bid, that the provisions required by ORS 279.348 through 279.363, and the Davis-Bacon Act, as may be applicable are to be complied with. Applicable state wage rates are included with the contract documents.

When applicable all bidding shall comply with Presidents Executive Order No. 11246. All bidders shall comply with the applicable provisions of the Equal Employment Opportunity Act of 1972 and the Civil Rights Act of 1964.

Each bid must be submitted on the prescribed form in a sealed envelope, and clearly marked on the outside that it is a bid. Each bid must be accompanied by a certified check or bid bond payable to the City of Newberg, Oregon, in an amount of not less than 10 percent of the total amount of the bid submitted. The successful Bidder will be required to furnish a bond for faithful performance on the contract in the full amount of the contract price.

The City of Newberg reserves the right to reject any or all bids, to waive informalities, and to accept the bid which is in the best interest of the City. No bidder may withdraw his bid for a period of thirty (30) calendar days after the date set for opening.

The undersigned, hereinafter called the Bidder, in compliance with your advertisement for bid offers to enter into a Contract with the City of Newberg, Oregon, hereinafter referred to as the Owner, to furnish all labor, materials, equipment, supplies and machinery to construct the project in accordance with the Contract Documents, within the time set forth therein, and at the prices stated below.

The Bidder declares that he has carefully examined the plans and specifications with related documents, that he has personally inspected the site of the proposed work; that he has satisfied himself as to the quantities involved including materials and equipment, and is familiar with all of the conditions surrounding the construction of the proposed project including availability of materials and labor. THE BIDDER ALSO AGREES TO COMPLY WITH ALL CURRENT AIA SPECIFICATIONS.

The Bidder further declares that the Bid is made according to the provisions and under the terms of the Contract Documents, which are hereby made a part of this Bid, and that the prices below are to cover all expenses incurred in performing the work required under the Contract Documents of which this Bid is a part.

The Bidder agrees that if this Bid is accepted, he will, within ten calendar days after notification of acceptance, execute the Contract with the Owner; and will at that time deliver to the Owner the Performance and Payment Bond and insurance documents required herein, and will, to the extent of his Bid, furnish all labor, equipment and materials necessary to complete the work in the manner, in the time, and according to the methods as specified in the Contract Documents and required by the Community Development Director.

The Bidder further agrees to begin work within ten calendar days after receipt of written "Notice to Proceed" of the owner and to fully complete the project within sixty (60) consecutive calendar days thereafter. Bidder further agrees to pay as liquidated damages, the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150.00) for each consecutive calendar day thereafter until the work shall have been finished. Sundays and legal holidays shall be excluded in determining days in default.

The Bidder further proposes to accept as full payment for the work proposed herein the amounts computed under the provisions of the General Provisions and based on the following schedule of lump sum or unit price amounts, it being expressly understood that the unit prices are independent of the exact quantities involved. The Bidder agrees that the lump sum prices and unit prices represent a true measure of the labor and materials required to perform the work, including all allowances for overhead and profit for each type and unit of work called for in these Contract Documents.

The undersigned Bidder hereby agrees that the provisions of ORS 279.348 to 279.356 will be complied with, so that the undersigned Bidder and Bidder's subcontractors will pay to their employees not less than the specified minimum prevailing rate of wage as determined by the Oregon Commissioner of the Bureau of Labor and Industries, and further agrees to pay such wages not less than once per week.

The Bidder shall pay a fee equal to one-tenth of one percent (.1 percent) of the price of this contract. The fee shall be paid on or before the first progress payment or 60 days from the date work first began on the contract, whichever comes first. The fee is payable to the Bureau of Labor and Industries and shall be mailed or otherwise delivered to the Bureau at: Bureau of Labor and Industries, Wage and Hour Division, Prevailing Wage Unit, 800 NE Oregon Street, #32, Portland, Oregon 97232.

The unit prices shall include all labor, materials, equipment, tools, overhead, profit, insurance, etc., to complete the work called for.

It is agreed that if the Bidder is awarded the Contract for the work herein proposed and shall fail or refuse to execute the Contract and furnish the required Performance and Payment Bond within the time herein proposed, then, in that event, the bid security deposited herewith shall be retained by the Owner as liquidated damages.

The Bidder understands that the Owner may reject any or all bids and waive any informalities in the bidding.

The Bidder agrees that this bid shall be good and may not be withdrawn for a period of thirty (30) calendar days after the scheduled closing time for receiving bids.

RECOMMENDATION: Council approve the attached resolution authorizing the City Manager to enter into a construction contract with Colamette Construction Co. to remodel of the Public Works Facility.

BACKGROUND: The project consists of converting 2 existing truck bays, a storage room and the lavatory/locker room to a lunch/meeting room, a men's restroom/locker room, a mud room, an ADA compliant unisex restroom with shower, and three work stations for record-keeping. Also included are electrical, HVAC and lighting upgrades throughout the facility.

The remodeling of the Public Works Facility was budgeted at \$70,000 (Account Number 04.5150.731006). The following bids were received from the following contractors:

•	Colamette Construction Co.	\$ 71,477
•	Bill's Quality Construction	\$ 80,381
•	Rodriguez Corporation	\$129,387

The low bid of \$71,477 was submitted by Colamette Construction Co. for the work proposed. Public Works Superintendent Russ Thomas has been working with Colamette Construction to reduce the estimated construction cost to a point less than the budget amount. Mr. Thomas has received confirmation of a reduced price on the project. The total estimated cost (per Mr. Thomas' memo dated April 27, and enclosed as Attachment 1) is \$66,077.00.

FISCAL IMPACT: Award of this contract will obligate the City to Colamette Construction Co. In the amount of \$66,077.00 on successful prosecution of the work. The funds have been budgeted and are available. Any contract modifications which arise during the course of the project will be considered separately by staff.

STRATEGIC ASSESSMENT: Completion of this project will allow Public Works staff to have adequate facilities for personnel, meeting, and training needs. Public works does not currently have an ADA restroom, or a shower facility, as required by OSHA and current O.R.S. regulations. Remodeled facility will meet all current requirements.



Subject: Public Works Shop remodel.. Value Engineering bid adjustment

After opening and review of the bids for the Public Works Shop Remodel, which had Colamette Construction as the low bidder, at \$ 71,477, which was over the budgeted amount of \$70,000, I investigated ways to reduce the bid amount to within the budgeted amount.

I contacted Carl Dunn of Colamette Construction to discuss what could be done in the way of value engineering to reduce the bid amount to bring it within our budgeted amount. After discussing the alternatives available with him, I think that the attached changes as per the attached Value Engineering suggestion list will produce the desired finished project, and under budget.

Item # 1.

Acceptable. Anticipated savings of \$2,500.

Item #2

Acceptable. Anticipated savings of \$200.

Item #3

Item #4

May not be a viable option as the partitions are gone from City Hall, and

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the shower may not work in our application. No anticipated savings. Acceptable. This has been used with success in the Public Safety

Item #5


Building. Anticipated savings of \$2,400.

Acceptable, however Romex may not be permissible by electrical codes. The reduction in light fixtures is acceptable. Anticipated savings \$300

The above recommendations bring the final bid price to \$66,077. This is under the budgeted amount, and under the remaining budget amount of \$66, 431. An additional reduction of \$1,900 may be realized if the shower in item #3 is usable, and if Romex wiring in Item #5 is allowed. Given these reductions, I recommend that we proceed with this project.

As requested by Mr. Russ Thomas, Colamette Construction Company is pleased to provide the following value engineering suggestions for the aforementioned project.

- 1) We suggest installing rubber base in lieu of the coved base shown on sheet 5. We propose using VCT floor covering and 4" rubber base in the lunchroom, entry and hallway. Sheet vinyl and 6" rubber base should be used in the locker room, washroom and unisex restroom. These flooring revisions will save \$2,500.00.
- 2) We propose deleting the cabinet under the sink in the unisex restroom shown on sheet 3. An ADA approved wall mounted sink should be installed instead for a savings of \$200.00.
- Mr. Thomas indicated that a used ADA shower, currently in the old City Hall, may be available. If the shower is in good condition and fits the proposed application, then a savings of \$900.00 is possible. If the City of Newberg is able to furnish used toilet partitions in good condition, we propose a \$550.00 deduct from the bid price. These prices do not include any paint, touch up or repair of any kind. Removal from the City Hall is also excluded.
- We suggest installing an acoustical t-bar ceiling rather than framing a new ceiling and using gypsum board. The t-bar ceiling would hang from wires attached to the bottom of the existing trusses. The ceiling panels would be flat, 2x4. A small wood framed loft would be constructed to support the new mechanical unit. The insulation would lay on top of the suspended ceiling. We offer a savings of \$2,400.00 for this revision.
- 5) We propose using Romex wiring method in lieu of MC and EMT conduit for a cost savings of \$1,000.00. We offer a price reduction of \$300.00 to delete three of the light fixtures in the lunch room and one light fixture in the mens toilet area.

If all of the above value engineering items are selected, a total of \$7,850.00 could be deducted from our bid price.
