Due to my experience with Bankruptcy notices, I have come to the conclusion that it actually costs the City money for them to be processed. I have worked for the City for about 4 years now. I have about 9 years of experience working with Bankruptcy notices when one includes my job experience prior to the City of Newberg.

In my job prior to the City of Newberg, I remember receiving about three (3) checks in the amount less than Three Dollars (\$3.00) each. During my time at the City of Newberg, we have received one check for about \$1,200.00 for payment of water/sewer. Judy Peterson (Water Dept.) was as surprised as I was to actually receive payment let alone this enormous amount. In general, when payment is dispersed to creditors, it is in annual payments of a couple of dollars.

Further, it takes approximately one half hour to gather the debt information, complete the claim form, send it in to the Bankruptcy Court, and keep record of it per Bankruptcy notice.

Therefore, it is my belief that this costs the City money in the long run to process the claim forms due to the really low payment rate.

I would like to request a policy that Bankruptcy notices <u>not</u> be processed <u>unless</u> the City has a total debt of \$300.00 or more for the Debtor.
