The following survey research report provides some valuable information regarding the public's perception of cities of Newberg, Dundee, Newberg School District, and Chehalem Park and Recreation District, and the list of potential projects currently being considered. This report should assist in helping the strategic planning committee identify projects the community views as most important.

Below, The Nelson Report has highlighted the key results of the survey research report. The final report is over 200 pages in length, with multiple tables designed to assist the district in understanding and analyzing the respondents' views.

Throughout this executive summary, The Nelson Report identifies "key" demographics for many of the questions. Key demographics are those subgroups that respond at a higher percentage rate than the total sample for any given response. The key demographic groups for any given opinion are not necessarily the only subgroups in the survey who share that opinion. They are however, the ones that hold that opinion most strongly.

A total of 375 respondents were interviewed between October 18 and October 24, 2001. The margin of error for this survey is +/-5.0% at the 95% level of confidence.

MOST SERIOUS PROBLEMS FACING OREGON TODAY

Issues surrounding the “economy” were perceived to be the most serious problems facing Oregon today, followed by issues relating to “growth”, “ and “schools/education”.

Below, the top answers are displayed in more detail. The full responses can be found in the final report. Since this question and other open-ended questions call for multiple responses, the results are displayed in terms of the percentage of respondents who mentioned a particular issue (totaling over 100%) and the percentage of total responses (totals 100%). The top responses are listed below in descending numerical order.

The issues have been grouped according to the subjective interpretation of The Nelson Report and can be regrouped as the reader sees fit.

MOST SERIOUS PROBLEMS FACING NEWBERG-DUNDEE AND SURROUNDING AREAS TODAY

Respondents clearly identified issues relating to “growth” as the most serious problems facing Newberg-Dundee and the surrounding area today, followed by “schools/education”, and the “economy”.

Again, in the following table the issues have been grouped according to the subjective interpretation of The Nelson Report and can be regrouped as the reader sees fit.

PERFORMANCE RATING: CITY OF NEWBERG

A large majority of respondents (60%) gave the City of Newberg a positive performance rating (excellent-5%, pretty good-55%), while 29% rated the city negatively (only fair-22%, poor-7%). Another eleven percent were not sure how to rate the City of Newberg.

Key demographics who gave the City of Newberg a positive rating were males (62%), 18-34 years old (72%), respondents of other ethnic groups (78%), Multi-ethnic respondents (67%), Hispanic respondents (66%), respondents working in the Newberg-Dundee area (62%), residents of 11-15 years (76%), non-voters (84%), voters in 1 out of 4 elections (65%), and Newberg (67%).

In a special cross tab, 61% of those who later **avored** the cities of Newberg and Dundee jointly providing certain governmental services (38% of all respondents) gave the city a **positive** performance rating.

In another interesting cross tab, 59% of those who later **opposed** the cities of Newberg and Dundee jointly providing certain governmental services (11% of all respondents) gave the City of Newberg a **positive** performance rating.

In yet another cross tab, 29% of those who later **avored** the cities of Newberg and Dundee jointly providing certain governmental services (18% of all respondents) gave the city a **negative** performance rating.

PERFORMANCE RATING: CITY OF DUNDEE

A plurality of respondents (22%), gave the City of Dundee a negative performance rating (only fair-14%, poor-8%), while 18% rated the city positively (excellent-2%, pretty good-16%). A large majority, (60%) were not sure how to rate the City of Dundee.

In a small sub-sample, isolating only Dundee residents, a plurality (47%) gave the city a negative performance rating (only fair-32%, poor-15%), while 39% rated the city positively (excellent-7%, pretty good-32%). Fourteen percent were not sure how to rate the City of Dundee.

Key demographics who gave the City of Dundee a negative rating were males (26%), 45-54 years old (25%), Hispanic and Multi-ethnic respondents (33%), respondents without children in the Newberg School District (24%), respondents working in the Newberg-Dundee area (24%), residents of 0-5 years (30%), non-voters (36%), voters in 4 out of 4 elections (24%), Dundee (47%), and rural area (27%).

PERFORMANCE RATING: NEWBERG SCHOOL DISTRICT

Well over half of respondents (55%), gave the Newberg School District a positive performance rating (excellent-9%, pretty good-46%), while 24% rated the district negatively (only fair-18%, poor-6%). Another 21% were not sure how to rate the school district.

Key demographics who gave the Newberg School District a positive rating were females (57%), 35-44 years old (61%), 45-54 years old (60%), Hispanic respondents (100%), respondents of other ethnic groups (78%), respondents with children in the Newberg School District (81%), respondents working in the Newberg-Dundee area (60%), residents of over 15 years (63%), 11-15 years (58%), voters in 1 out of 4 elections (61%), 4 out of 4 elections (58%), non-voters (56%), and Newberg (58%).

PERFORMANCE RATING: CHEHALEM PARK AND RECREATION DISTRICT

A high percentage of respondents (68%), gave the Chehalem Park and Recreation District a positive performance rating (excellent-22%, pretty good-46%), while fewer numbers (16%), rated the district negatively (only fair-12%, poor-4%). Another sixteen percent were not sure how to rate the district.

Key demographics who gave the Chehalem Park and Recreation District a positive rating were females (70%), 45-54 years old (75%), respondents of other ethnic groups (100%), respondents with children in the Newberg School District (70%), respondents working in the Newberg-Dundee area (71%), residents of 11-15 years (71%), over 15 years (70%), non-voters (72%), and Newberg (73%).

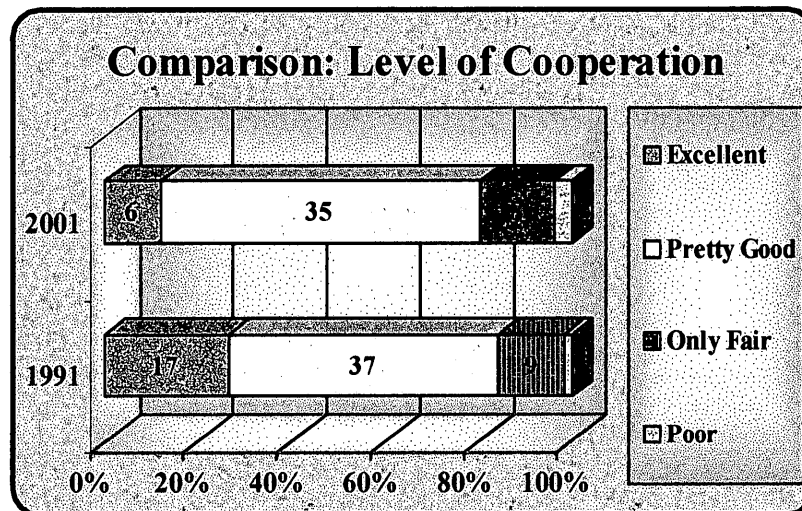

COOPERATION RATING: CITIES OF NEWBERG, DUNDEE, NEWBERG SCHOOL DISTRICT AND CHEHALEM PARK AND RECREATION DISTRICT

A plurality of respondents (41%), gave the level of cooperation between the cities of Newberg, Dundee, the Newberg School District, and the Chehalem Park and Recreation District a positive rating (excellent-6%, pretty good-35%), while fewer numbers (10%), rated the level of cooperation negatively (only fair-8%, poor-2%). Nearly half of respondents (49%) were not sure how to rate the level of cooperation.

When comparing results to the survey conducted in 1991, there has been a noticeable decrease (-13%) in the cooperation rating between the cities of Newberg, Dundee, the Newberg School District, and the Chehalem Park and Recreation District. In 1991, 54% gave a positive cooperation rating (excellent-17%, pretty good-37%), while 10% gave a negative rating (only fair-9%, poor-1%). Thirty-six percent were not sure how to rate the level of cooperation.

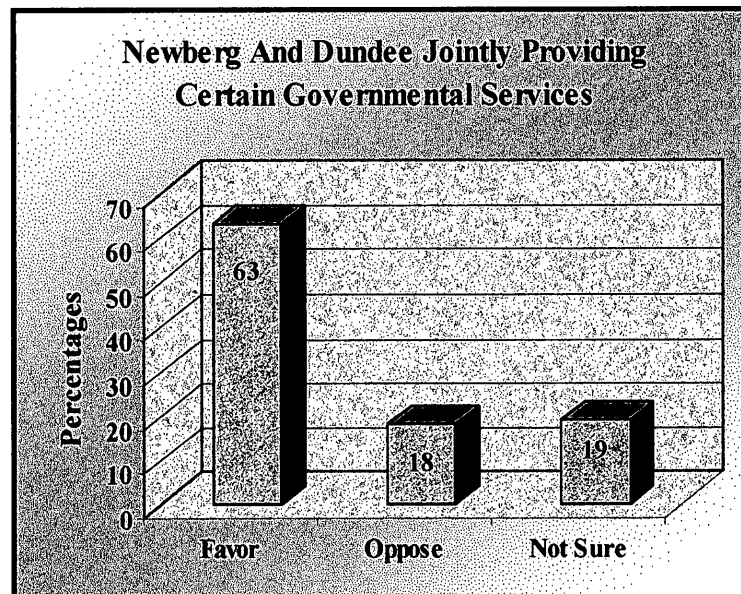

NEWBERG AND DUNDEE JOINTLY PROVIDING CERTAIN GOVERNMENTAL SERVICES

A large majority of respondents (63%) favored the cities of Newberg and Dundee jointly providing certain governmental services, while 18% opposed. Nineteen percent were not sure, as the chart below indicates.



Key demographics who favored jointly providing services were males (65%), 18-34 years old (73%), 35-44 years old (65%), Multi-ethnic respondents (83%), respondents of other ethnic groups (78%), Hispanic respondents (67%), respondents with children in the Newberg School District (65%), residents of over 15 years (67%), non-voters (72%), voters in 3 out of 4 elections (67%), 1 out of 4 elections (65%), Dundee (66%), and Newberg (65%).

Key groups who opposed the cities of Newberg and Dundee jointly providing services were 55-64 years old (23%), 35-44 years old (20%), respondents of other ethnic groups (22%), residents of 11-15 and over 15 years (20%), voters in 1 out of 4 elections (20%), Dundee (22%), and rural area (21%).

RATING: QUALITY OF LIFE NEWBERG, DUNDEE AND SURROUNDING AREAS

An extremely high number of respondents (91%) rated the quality of life in Newberg, Dundee and the surrounding areas positively (excellent-27%, pretty good-64%), while fewer numbers (8%), rated the quality of life negatively (only fair-6%, poor-2%). One percent of respondents were not sure how to rate the quality of life in Newberg, Dundee, and the surrounding areas.

Key demographics who rated the quality of life positively were 18-34 years old (97%), 35-44 years old (95%), Hispanic respondents (100%), Caucasian respondents (93%), respondents with children in the Newberg School District (93%), residents of 6-10 years (97%), 0-5 years (94%), non-voters (96%), and Newberg (94%).

A very high percentage of respondents rated “providing an hourly link to Tri-Met’s transit system”, and “a construction project that would replace portable classrooms at Newberg High School” as highest priorities. A large number of respondents also gave “safety, security, and energy improvements to Mabel Rush and Ewing Young Elementary schools”, “building and improving roads to alleviate congestion”, and the “development of agreements between local governments to jointly operate, and maintain basic services” a higher priority ranking. On the other hand, “moving Dundee’s downtown commercial district away from Highway 99”, “developing a community center in Dundee”, and “creating a public self-supporting 18-hole golf course” were given lower priority rankings.

AGREE/DISAGREE

In this series, respondents were presented with a number of potentially prejudicial statements regarding the cities of Newberg, Dundee, Newberg School District, and Chehalem Park and Recreation District, and their proposed projects. This format was designed to serve as a cross-check on various close-ended questions as well as to pick up variations on prejudices not readily apparent in those types of questions.

The results are displayed in two different tables. In the first table, the highest priority projects have been isolated and set against their corresponding agree/disagree questions. The second table simply displays all of the agree/disagree statements in descending order of agreement.

CONCLUSIONS

1. Issues surrounding the "economy" are perceived as the most serious problems facing Oregon today, followed by issues relating to "growth", and "schools/education".
2. Respondents clearly identify issues relating to "growth" as the most serious problems facing Newberg-Dundee and the surrounding area today, followed by "schools/education", and "the economy". A need for a bypass is the overwhelming growth issue.
3. A large majority of respondents give the City of Newberg a positive performance rating while just under a third rate the city negatively.
4. "Doing well" tops the list of reasons for giving the city a positive rating, followed by "no problems", and "takes care of problems".
5. Main reasons respondents give the city a negative rating are "room for improvement", "government", and "need bypass/traffic".
6. A plurality of respondents give the City of Dundee a negative rating, while fewer numbers rate the city positively. An unusually large number of respondents are not sure how to rate the city. In a small sub-sample, isolating only Dundee residents, less than half give the city a negative rating, while fewer numbers rate the city positively.
7. Primary reasons for a negative rating are "traffic/need bypass", "problems between government/mayor/council", and "they are trying".
8. "Need bypass" tops the list of reasons for giving the city a positive rating, followed by "what I see/read/hear", "do pretty good", and "pretty progressive".
9. Well over half of respondents give the Newberg School District a positive performance rating, while just under a quarter rate the district negatively.
10. Principal reasons for giving the district a positive rating are, "children are getting educated/doing well", and "what I hear/see/read".
11. Foremost reasons for giving the district a negative rating are "overcrowded", "poor quality of education", "drop out rate", and "lack of funding".
12. A very high percentage of respondents give the Chehalem Park and Recreation District a positive performance rating, while fewer numbers rate the district negatively.

13. Main reasons for giving a positive rating are "variety of activities for all ages", and "children's activities".
14. "Expensive" tops the list of reasons for giving the district a negative rating, followed by "personal experience", and "room for improvement".
15. A plurality of respondents give the level of cooperation between the cities of Newberg, Dundee, the Newberg School District, and the Chehalem Park and Recreation District a positive rating, while fewer numbers rate the level of cooperation negatively. In addition, when comparing to results from 1991, there has been a noticeable decrease in the cooperation rating with the difference primarily going to the undecided column.
16. Principal reasons for giving a positive cooperation rating are "work together/get along", "no problems", and "from I see/hear/know".
17. Foremost reasons for giving a negative cooperation rating are "what I hear/read", and "get along most of the time".
18. A large majority of respondents favor the cities of Newberg and Dundee jointly providing certain governmental services, while fewer numbers opposed.
19. Top reasons for opposing the cities jointly providing services are, "should stay separate/function better separately", Dundee has a lot of issues/Newberg should not get involved", and "would like to see library/police and fire departments connected".
20. An extremely high number of respondents rate the quality of life in Newberg, Dundee and the surrounding areas positively, while fewer numbers rate the quality of life negatively.
21. "Nice place to live" tops the list of reasons for giving a positive quality of life rating followed by, "small town feel", and "crime is low/feel safe".
22. Primary reasons for giving a negative quality of life rating are "traffic", "overcrowded", and "room for improvement".
23. A very high percentage of respondents rate "providing an hourly link to Tri-Met's transit system" and "a construction project that would replace portable classrooms at Newberg High School" as highest priorities. A large number of respondents also give "safety, security and energy improvements to Mabel Rush and Ewing Young Elementary schools", "building and improving roads to alleviate congestion", and the "development of agreements between local governments to jointly operate, and maintain basic services" a higher priority ranking. On the other hand, "moving Dundee's downtown commercial district away from Highway 99", "developing a community center in Dundee", and "creating a public self-supporting 18-hole golf course" are given lower priority rankings.

24. Clearly the community has identified issues relating to growth, and more specifically to traffic as serious issues for Newberg, Dundee and the surrounding areas. These issues, however, have not had a negative impact on respondent's quality of life. A good part of the community does not appear aware of the collaboration occurring between the cities of Newberg, Dundee, the Newberg School District, and the Chehalem Park and Recreation District, although a large majority support the cities jointly providing certain governmental services. Important priorities to the community appear to be related to improving roads, easing traffic congestion, and linking the community to the Portland metropolitan area. Education projects also rate as very high priorities.

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METHODOLOGY

The survey was carried out by telephone, using skilled interviewers under the close supervision of Mark Nelson. All interviewers attended a briefing session prior to conducting the interviews. All aspects of sampling and interviewing procedures were fully explained at this meeting. Interviewers also received a set of detailed written instructions to help answer any questions that might arise.

The sampling procedure was designed to produce an approximation of the adult voting population, 18 years of age or older.

Interviewing was conducted at times when adults in general are most likely to be at home, which means on weekends, or if on weekdays, after 5:00 p.m.

Sample Size

A total sample size of 374 respondents was used for this survey. The survey was conducted from October 18, 2001 through October 23, 2001.

Sampling Tolerances

In interpreting survey results, one should bear in mind that all sample surveys are subject to sampling error; that is, the extent to which the results may differ from what may be obtained if the whole population surveyed had been interviewed. The size of such sampling errors depends largely upon the number of interviews.

The following table may be used in estimating the sampling error of any total response percentage or any major demographic group percentage in the survey. The computed allowances take into account the effect the sample design has upon sampling error. They may be interpreted as indicating the range (plus or minus that figure shown) within which the results of repeated samplings in the same time period could be expected to vary, 95 percent of the time, assuming the same sampling procedure, the same interviewers and the same questionnaire were used.

Let us say a reported percentage is 33 for a group which includes 400 respondents. Then we go to row "Percentages Near 30" in the table and go across to the column headed "400." The number at this point is 6.0, which means that the 33 percent obtained in the sample is subject to a sampling error of plus or minus 6.0 points. Another way of saying it is that very probably (95 chances out of 100), the average of repeated samplings would be somewhere between 27.0 percent and 39.0 percent, with the most likely figure the 33 percent obtained.
