Authority to increase fees

- 468B.051 Fees for water quality permits and programs.
 - Increase up to 3% so long as anticipated increase in costs is greater or equal to the proposed fee increase.
 - May increase fees greater than 3% if provided for in DEQ's legislatively approved budget.
 - EQC may increase fees once per year for water quality permitting, underground injection control permitting, 401 dredge and fill certification, wastewater operator certification, and onsite wastewater management program.

Proposed fees

3% increase applies to application and renewal fees, annual fees, and surcharges for:

- Underground Injection Control Program OAR 340-045-0075
- 401 Dredge and Fill Water Quality
 Certification Program OAR 340-048-0055
- Wastewater Operator Certification Program OAR 340-049-0065
- Water Quality Permitting Program OAR 340-071-0140 and OAR 340-045-0075

17% increase applies to:

Onsite Wastewater Management Program OAR 340-071-0800

- 3% yearly increase (468B.051) and
- 14% authorized by POP 123 during 2023 Legislative session to fund resource enhancements only for the *residential or direct services* onsite septic system oversite (not WPCF)



Increasing costs

Budget Period	Cost per FTE
2021-2023 Legislatively Adopted Budget	\$354,862
2023-2025 Legislatively Adopted Budget	\$378,921
Percent increase over two-year period	7.06%

- Budgeted cost increase of programs is 3.53% percent per year
- Actual cost increases per year will be larger than the budgeted increase due to salary increases from the 2023 state collective bargaining agreement
 - December 2023 Cost of Living Adjustment 6.5%
 - January 2025 Cost of Living Adjustment 6.55%
- DEQ endeavors to adjust fees incrementally, but larger fee increases may be needed in the future just to maintain current service levels



Water Quality Permitting Program

- Maintains, enhances and protects Oregon's waters from the discharge of pollutants through the permitting, compliance, and enforcement process.
- Includes Stormwater, NPDES (surface water waste dischargers), WPCF (all other waste dischargers), Some Onsite Septic Systems, and General permits.
- Permits municipalities, industries, and federal and state agencies.
- 87 FTE (Full-time equivalent)
- Last fee increase: 3% in 2023



Wastewater Operator Certification Program

- A certified operator is required for all wastewater plants in Oregon treating human sewage to responsibly control their systems.
- About 1400 operators ensure ~400 public and private wastewater systems are managed to protect public health and the environment.
- DEQ's program is 100% fee-funded.
- 2 FTE statewide
- Last fee increase: 60% in 2013





Underground Injection Control Program

- Protects freshwater aquifers from contamination due to UICs.
- Assists municipalities, businesses and residences statewide.
- Last fee increase: 7% in 2019
 Prior to 2019, no increase for 12 years
- 2.4 FTE statewide



401 Dredge and Fill Water Quality Certification Program

- Reviews and evaluates the water quality impacts of projects requiring a federal permit or license that may result in a discharge to waters of the U.S.
- Issues certifications to ensure existing water uses will not be degraded.
- Reviews applications from municipalities, state agencies, businesses and residences.
- 4.5 FTE statewide
- Last fee increase: 2013 (fee structure varied)





Onsite Wastewater Management Program

- Oversight of statewide septic systems
 - Larger WPCF permitted systems
 - Smaller, primarily residential, systems (direct services)
- Licenses sewage disposal services
- Last fee increase for direct services and licenses: 3% in 2017
- 14 FTE statewide
