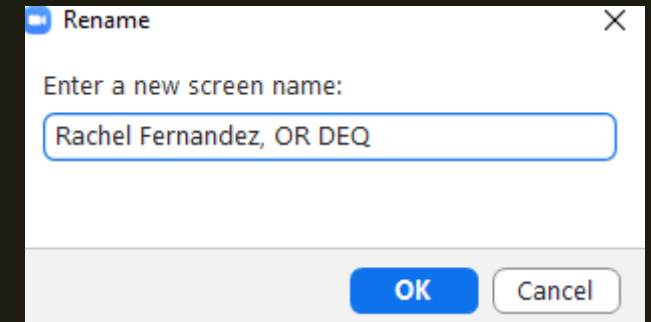

# CPP 2024 rulemaking

- Significantly reduce greenhouse gas emissions
- Achieve co-benefits from other air pollution reductions
- Enhance public welfare for Oregon communities, particularly Oregon's environmental justice communities.
- Environmental justice communities means communities of color, communities experiencing lower incomes, communities experiencing health inequities, tribal communities, rural communities, remote communities, coastal communities, communities with limited infrastructure and other communities traditionally underrepresented in public processes and adversely harmed by environmental and health hazards, including seniors, youth and persons with disabilities.

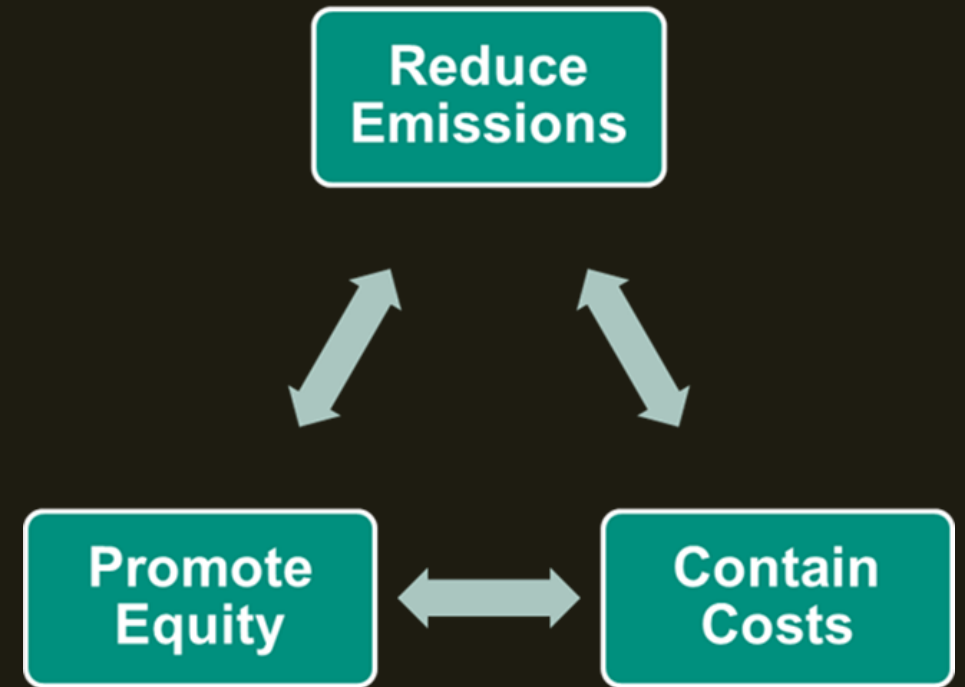


- ↑ Greater pollution exposure

# CPP 2024 rulemaking

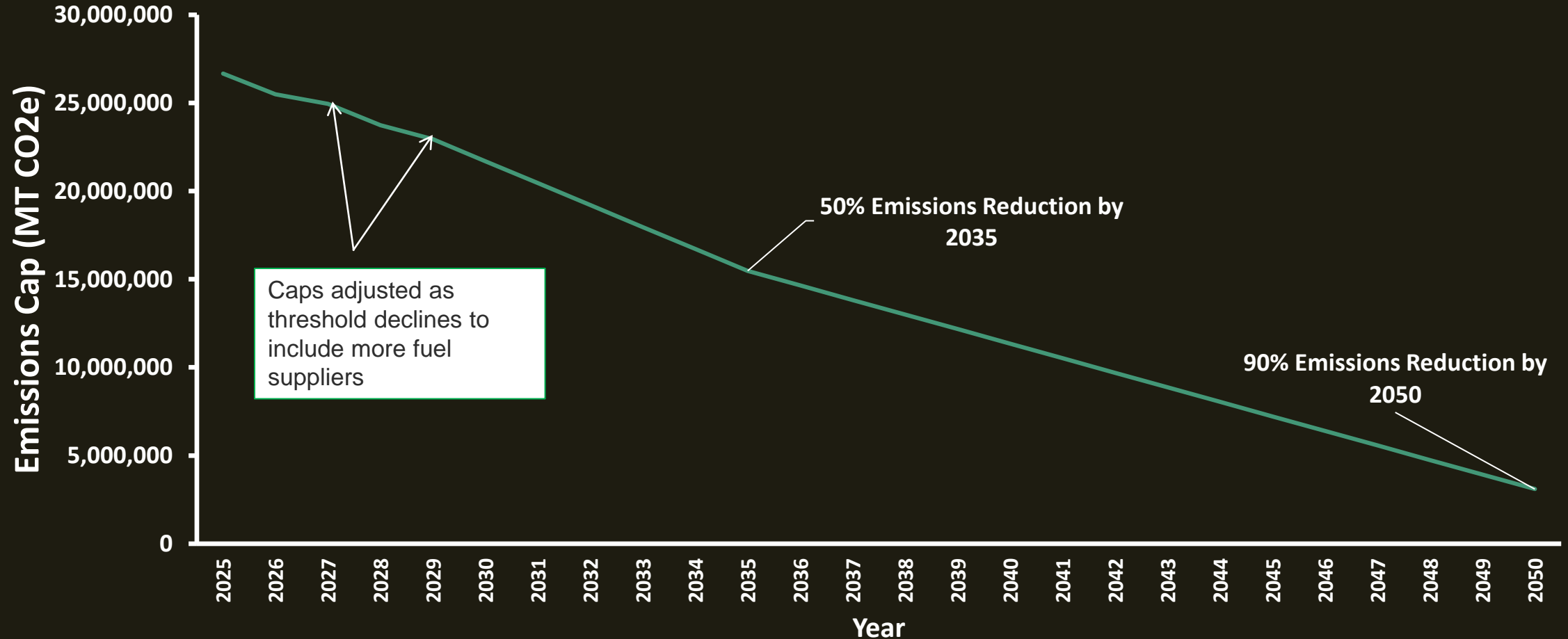
- Sets declining limit, or cap, on greenhouse gas emissions
- Prioritizes reduction of greenhouse gases and other air contaminants in environmental justice communities
- Provides regulated entities with compliance options to minimize business and consumer impacts

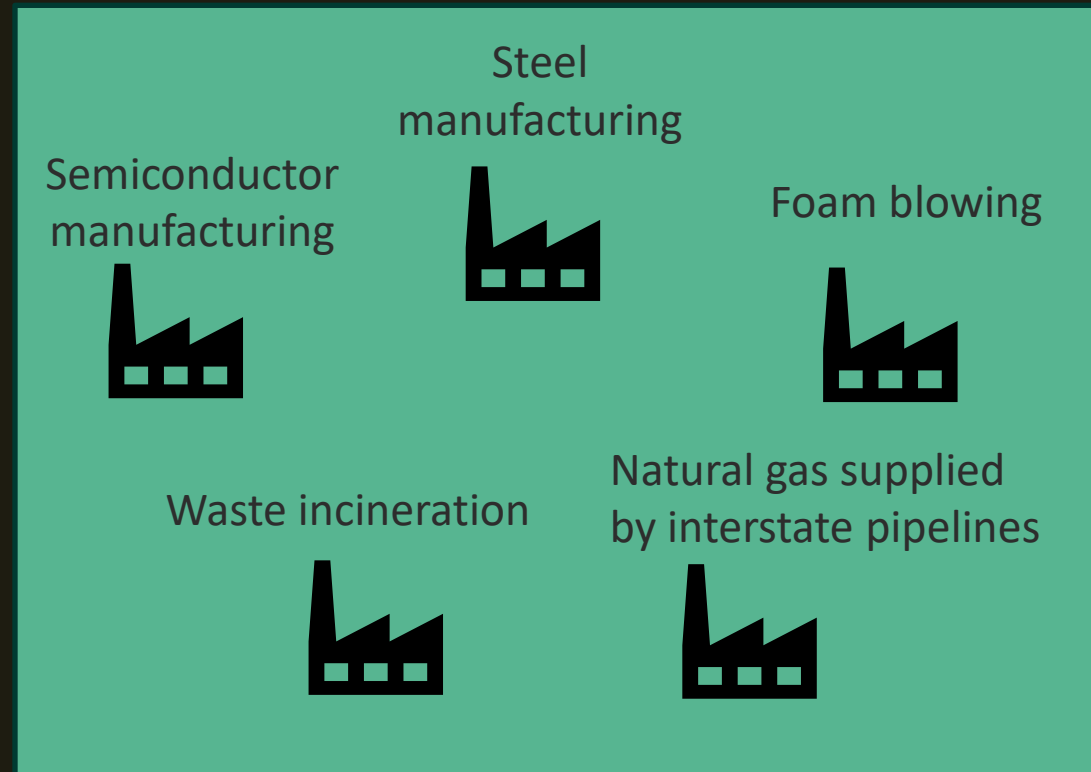

# Best Available Emission Reductions

- Smaller universe of industrial emissions
- Not include in emissions caps
- Site specific approach
