Oregon E-Cycles

- Statewide program
- Requires electronics manufacturers to provide responsible recycling for their devices
- Since 2009, over 300 million pounds collected
- Changes begin 2026

E-Cycles 2026: Changes to the Program

	People in Oregon	More devices accepted; convenient and equitable service.
2	Collection Sites	More permanent collection sites required statewide
	Manufacturers and PROs	Clarification on administrative and coordination requirements
m	DEQ	Administrative efficiencies; continue oversight

Summary of Proposed Rules

- DEQ is proposing administrative rules to implement the Oregon E-Cycles law.
- DEQ recommends rules be placed in Chapter 340, Divisions 12 and 98.

Summary of Rules

Proposed rules address the following topics:

- Market share
- Producer responsibility organization fees
- Program plan
- Environmentally sound management practices

- Fair financial compensation
- Annual reports
- Coordinating body
- Product categories
- Manufacturer obligation calculation



Market share

- DEQ will make a preliminary determination of market share and notify manufacturer
- A manufacturer has 30 days to request changes
- DEQ then makes final determination and notify

Producer responsibility organization fees

- Plan review fee: \$75,000 for initial plan
- Annual fee: \$315,000
 - Divided equally among PROs
 - DEQ may reduce for a given year
 - Due June 1 of each year, beginning June 1, 2026

Program plan

- DEQ may require letter of intent
- Plan due July 1 annually, unless directed otherwise by DEQ
- DEQ may require plan to describe how program will comply with ORS 459A.305 to 459A.355

Environmentally sound management practices

- Sets standards for practices
- Specifies required practices
 - Examples: Recordkeeping, requirements for service providers and downstream vendors, PRO monitoring
- Clarifies DEQ administration
 - DEQ may approve alternative practices
 - DEQ may use tracking devices

Fair financial compensation

- PRO may review costs across collection sites or use reasonable estimates
- PRO and coordinating body must cooperate and provide information to DEQ
- DEQ may periodically conduct a study on, or approve a PRO to study, compensation
 - Cooperation of PRO and coordinating body required

Annual reports

- Due March 1, unless directed otherwise by DEQ
- DEQ may require information on whether program complied with approved plan and ORS 459A.305 to 459A.355

Coordinating body

- Letter of intent and information to evaluate a prospective coordinating body
- If PROs cannot designate a coordinating body, DEQ may designate
- DEQ may direct coordination

Product categories

Category	Includes
1	desktop computers, portable computers, and small-scale servers
2	printers, scanners, and fax machines
3	monitors and televisions
4	portable digital music players, digital video disc players, digital video disc recorders, videocassette recorders, video game consoles, digital converter boxes, cable receivers, satellite receivers, routers, and modems
5	peripherals

Manufacturer obligation calculation

- Clarifies process to calculate a manufacturer's manufacturer obligation
- PRO or coordinating body shall use weight of devices recycled in the program during the previous year
 - For 2026, may use national data, consumer research, sampling, or similar data from 2025 to apportion costs and reconcile apportionment in subsequent years.

Other Rule Amendments Include:

- Clarifies rules that will only be used until Dec. 31, 2025, including
 - Manufacturer registration fees
 - DEQ revenue need
 - Market share process
- Provides definitions for additional terms
- Division 12 rules
 - Compliance and enforcement
