Community Development Director Scot Siegel and James Dingwall Assistant

Planner provided a high-level overview and answers to questions from Councilors in June. Dingwall talked through the stipulations for the UGB Sequential

process.

Staff is recommending the City request that the Oregon Department of Land Conservation and Development modify the City's Sequential UGB work program to include the adoption of an economic opportunities analysis only, and reschedule the City's adoption of an updated Housing Needs Analysis and Housing Production Strategy to align with the Oregon Department of Land Conservation and Developments 2027/28 schedule for compliance with state housing requirements. They also recommend the Council consider whether to explore a one-time UGB amendment as provided by Oregon Senate Bill 1537

and provide direction to staff.

of the Construction Excise Tax Fund, which expired its collection efforts on July 1, 2023. Wagner provided an overview of the applicants for pieces of the funds. Staff is seeking city council direction on the remaining \$1m

for a second notice of funding availability, and

direction regarding the allocation of the \$62,598.47

administrative fee.

Councilor Mike McBride said he wanted to see every dollar go to the Yamhill County Housing Commission, saying that would immediately help residents and repairs for in-need mobile homes. Councilor Kilburg agreed. Councilors agreed to add the \$62 thousand into the general fund if legal is able to make it work.
