#### HOUSING PRODUCTION STRATEGY

Beginning in spring 2024, the City of The Dalles began the process of conducting a series of discussions on a Housing Production Strategy (HPS), which will outline specific tools, actions, and policies to address housing needs and affordability. Led by Cascadia Partners and funded by a grant from the Department of Land Conservation and Development, this strategy builds on the 2023 Housing Needs Analysis and Residential Building Lands Inventory, as required by Oregon House Bill 2003. City staff and Cascadia Partners will hold work sessions with an Advisory Committee, City Council, and the Planning Commission throughout the year, aiming to adopt the HPS by December 31, 2024.

#### AD-HOC COMMITTEE FOR A FEDERAL STREET PLAZA PLAN

At the September 9th City Council meeting, an ad-hoc committee was officially established to guide the development of a downtown plaza on Federal Street, between 1st and 2nd Streets. The committee will provide recommendations on the design, construction, and funding of the plaza, which will serve as a key feature in downtown revitalization efforts. In addition to shaping the project, the committee will collaborate with City staff to explore grant opportunities to support its funding. The plaza is part of the City's broader Vision Action Plan, focused on enhancing economic vitality and strengthening community life.

#### DOWNTOWN PARKING ASSESSMENT

In spring 2024, the City of The Dalles began a Downtown Parking Assessment to better understand the dynamics of our downtown parking system with help from Rick Williams Consulting, the assessment includes data collection, analysis, and recommendations for managing downtown parking. The City is reviewing its parking code and policies and held work sessions with an Advisory Committee of local stakeholders to gather input. Findings were shared at a community open house on September 30, 2024, but more discussions to follow.

#### **RESIDENTIAL TREE GRANT PROGRAM**



The City of The Dalles launched the second round of its Residential Tree Grant Program, offering grants to residents for planting trees to enhance the beauty of our community and provide beneficial shade. In 2023, The Beautification and Tree Committee awarded 27 trees through this program. In 2024, the Committee will be able to award more than 50 trees to improve our urban forest.

The number of applicants more than doubled this year, and we hope the program continues to grow. Applications are now closed, but you can apply again next summer for planting in the fall.

#### **FAMILY CARE ROOM**

The City of The Dalles Police Department is proud to announce a valuable new amenity for our female officers and young families. With a small investment, we've created a private nursing room at the department providing



a comfortable space for parents to care for their infants while continuing to serve the community.

This dedicated room offers new moms the flexibility to nurse their babies in a quiet, supportive environment, promoting a peaceful bonding experience. The design and furnishings were thoughtfully chosen in collaboration with our female officers, ensuring the space is both functional and welcoming. This initiative demonstrates the department's commitment to fostering a family-friendly workplace where all employees can thrive.

Local law enforcement agencies and first responders came together to celebrate public safety and connect with residents in a fun, relaxed atmosphere. The weather couldn't have been better, and attendees had the opportunity to explore police equipment, patrol cars, and even see live demonstrations, including drone technology and a canine performance by the Wasco County Sheriff's K-9 unit.

This year's event saw significant growth, with over 300 community members in attendance. Many left with small gifts and treats after engaging with the officers and learning more about their work. Police Chief Worthy shared, "This is one of my favorite community events. Seeing the smiling faces on all of the children was uplifting and one day I'd love to see a few of them in uniform keeping our community safe."

## OPERATION CLEAN SWEEP
