On February 7, 2023, DEQ issued a Temporary Closure Certificate for the facility identified above. It covers the following tanks:

Your temporary closure certificate expired on February 7, 2024. OAR 340-150-0167(2) specifies that, thirty days before the expiration of the certificate, you were required to have taken one of the following actions:

Option A. Submit an application for a change-in-service to non-regulated status or an application for permanent closure

Option B. Submit a written request to return the facility or tank to operational status

Enclosed, find the field citation 2024-FC-9098 citing this violation of Oregon Administrative Rules. The \$150 penalty is due by April 12, 2024, if you wish to participate in the expedited enforcement process. If you wish to contest the field citation and do not pay the penalty by that date, I will refer this matter to DEQ's Office of Compliance and Enforcement for formal enforcement.

In addition, there is a required corrective action to submit one of the two applications listed above by May 31, 2024. The forms are available on our website:

(<u>https://www.oregon.gov/deq/tanks/Pages/UST-Forms.aspx</u>) Since your tanks no longer have a valid certificate, you must also apply for an extension of temporary closure status for the time it will take either to decommission the tanks or bring them back into service.

Until such time as the tanks are permanently decommissioned and DEQ receives the decommissioning checklist and closure report, you will continue to be responsible for the applicable tank permit fees. The fees for both 2023 and 2024 are currently still outstanding.
