Three main proposed updates

- Update DEQ's adoption of federal regulations by reference. These changes, made by EPA, are already applicable to affected sources. Includes updates/changes to NSPS and NESHAP regulations.
- Adopt a new federal regulation, by reference, applicable to new municipal solid waste landfills.
- Adopt new rules to implement federal emission guidelines for existing municipal solid waste landfills (required or EPA provides a plan for the state).





Proposed Rules – Adopt New Federal Standards



Adopt by reference

- One new NSPS regulation (40 C.F.R. Part 60, Subpart XXX)
 - New/Modified Municipal Solid Waste Landfills







Proposed Rules – Adopt Rules to Implement Amended Federal Emission Guidelines

Adopt mostly by reference

- Amended emission guidelines (40 C.F.R. Part 60, Subpart Cf)
 - Existing Municipal Solid Waste Landfills





Proposed Rules – Adopt by Reference – Amended Federal Standards

- NESHAPs (examples):
 - Petroleum Refineries
 - Aerospace manufacturing and rework
 - Portland Cement Manufacturing
 - Wool Fiberglass Manufacturing
 - Publicly Owned Treatment Works
 - Coal and Oil Fired Electric Utility Steam Generating Units
- NSPSs (examples):
 - Stationary Compression and Spark Ignition Internal Combustion Engines
 - Crude Oil and Natural Gas Facilities

 - Adoption of new federal standards
 - Re-adoption of amended standards
 - Rules to implement amended federal emission guidelines for municipal solid waste landfills

DEQ Recommendation

DEQ recommends that the Environmental Quality Commission:

- 1. Adopt the proposed rules as seen in Attachment A as part of Chapter 340 of the Oregon Administrative Rules; and
- 2. Approve incorporating the amended OAR 340-236-0010 into the Oregon Clean Air Act State Implementation Plan under OAR 340-200-0040; and
- 3. Direct DEQ to submit the SIP revision to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency for approval; and
- Direct DEQ to submit the Oregon Amended State Plan to Implement the Emission Guidelines for Municipal Solid Waste Landfills to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency for approval.
