## Marion County's Rulemaking Petition

- Proposes revising Three Basin Rule (OAR 340-041-0350) to allow DEQ to issue NPDES permits for new sewage treatment plants discharging to groundwater
- Discharge requirements:
  - Preserve or improve water quality
  - Minimum 500 feet from surface water
  - "Functional equivalent" to direct discharge

## **2020 Wildfire Impacts**

- Catastrophic wildfires primarily across western Oregon
- Federal emergency declared Sept. 15, 2020
- Over 4,000 properties damaged statewide
- Within Three Basin Rule area, ~1,400 properties with onsite systems impacted
- Ongoing rebuilding efforts still occurring

### Context for Marion County's Petition

- Desire for economic development
- American Rescue Plan Act funding deadlines for a new treatment plant
- Functional equivalent discharge to the river

#### **Types of Wastewater Discharge Permits**





#### Maui Decision and Functional Equivalent Discharges

• Supreme Court:

Pollutant discharge to groundwater is 'functional equivalent' to direct surface water discharge.

- Requires NPDES permit
- Current Three Basin Rule, "functional equivalent" discharge NOT allowed

#### Three Basin Rule

- Adopted in 1976; and revised in 1995
- Major Drinking Water Source
- Extra protections:
  - Clackamas
  - McKenzie
  - North Santiam
- No new NPDES permits
- Permit subsurface discharge or land application for new systems

## **Commission Options**

- Commission options on a petition:
  - -Direct DEQ to initiate rulemaking proceedings
  - -Deny the petition
  - Deny the petition and direct DEQ to take other action(s)



# Agency Petition Evaluation

- DEQ agrees with basic premise of petition
  - Three Basin Rule may be barrier to replacing legacy systems with improved treatment
  - Maintain original intent of rule

# Agency Petition Evaluation (cont.)

- Marion County's proposed rule language requires modification:
  - Need more specificity regarding how to determine if discharge "improves or preserves water quality"
  - "Groundwater Discharge" definition
  - Their scope of allowable projects is very narrow



### Summary of Public Comments

- Open Sept. 6 to Oct. 6
- Received 40 comments
  - 26 in support of the petition
  - 5 with qualified support of the petition
  - 7 opposing the petition
  - 2 neutral

# Key Comments in Support of the Petition

- Need to replace older septic systems
- Rebuilding homes and businesses after 2020 wildfires
- Continue to maintain high quality water

## Key Comments Opposed to the Petition

- Diminish current protections
- Precedent for further petition amendments
- Emerging contaminants
- Exception already exists in current rule

# **Other Key Comments**

- Need to better understand the North Santiam River Basin
  - Groundwater/surface water dynamics
  - Nutrient baseline and nutrient impacts in Detroit Reservoir
  - Impact of wildfire

#### Recommendation to the Commission

- Direct DEQ to initiate rulemaking to amend the Three Basin Rule to allow NPDES permits under limited circumstances consistent with stated objectives of the rule.
  - Rule revisions will provide permitting pathways for discharging treated wastewater.
  - -Petition's rule language requires adjustments.
  - -Will require staff resources and may delay other projects.



#### **Proposed Motion Language**

*"I move that the Oregon Environmental Quality"* Commission direct DEQ to initiate rulemaking proceedings to revise the Three Basin Rule to allow NPDES permits under limited circumstances consistent with the stated objectives of the rule."
