The regular meeting of the Brookings Planning Commission was called to order by Chair Watwood at 7:00 pm in the Council Chambers at Brookings City Hall followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

### PLANNING COMMISSION CHAIR PERSON ANNOUNCEMENTS

Commissioner Skip Hunter addressed the Commission concerning his recusing himself at the previous meeting regarding File No. APP-1-23 and leaving the meeting and asking if it was appropriate for him to be included in the continuation of the hearing tonight. Motion made by Commissioner Wulkowicz to allow Commissioner Hunter to stay for the APP-1-23 continuation hearing but not be able to vote based on the fact that he did not hear all the public testimony presented at the last meeting; motion seconded and by a 5-1 vote with Commissioner Hunter abstaining and Commissioner Bond voting nay the motion carried.

### **PUBLIC HEARINGS**

4.1 In the matter of File No. CUP-8-23, a request for approval of a Conditional Use Permit to operate a Short Term Rental facility at 211 Marine Drive Spur; Assessors Map & Tax Lot No. 4113-05B-01100.

There was no ex parte contact, bias, personal interest, or conflicts of interest declared and no objection to the jurisdiction of the Planning Commission to hear the matter. The public hearing was opened at 7:17 pm. PWDS Director Tony Baron reviewed the staff report.

Applicant Salomeja Lescinskas, was present to answer any questions.

Appointment of Judge Pro Tem

# Recommended Motion:

Appoint Jim Fallman to Judge Pro Tem and authorize the Mayor to sign an agreement for services as Municipal Court Judge Pro Tem with a stipend of \$325 per court session.

## **Financial Impact:**

Estimated \$0 - 1,000 annually.

## Background/Discussion:

When Richard Harper retired as Municipal Court Judge in October 2020, Council appointed Gary Milliman, leaving a vacancy in the Judge Pro Tem position; a position Milliman previously held. The City has not had a Judge Pro Tem since.

James Fallman began serving as Judge Pro Tem for the City of Brookings in 2006. The City Council appointed Fallman to serve as Municipal Judge Pro Tem in 2006, 2011, and again in 2014. He has also been the presiding Municipal Court Judge for the City of Gold Beach since 2011.

Mayor Hedenskog and Council President Schreiber met with staff to review resumes, and recommend the appointment of Jim Fallman to Judge Pro Tem.

# AGREEMENT FOR SERVICES MUNICIPAL COURT JUDGE

This Agreement is made and entered into this \_\_\_\_\_ day of September, 2023, by and between the City of Brookings (City) a municipal corporation of the State of Oregon, and James Fallman (Fallman), collectively referred to as the "Parties."

#### **RECITALS**

Whereas, Fallman and City originally entered into an Agreement dated April 20, 2006, and most recently updated December 16, 2014, whereby Fallman was appointed to serve as Municipal Court Judge Pro Tem, and

**NOWTHEREFORE**, the Parties agree as follows:

#### TERMS OF AGREEMENT:

1. <u>Contract for services:</u> City contracts with Fallman for Municipal Court Judge services for the City of Brookings.

### 2. Duties of Municipal Judge Pro Tem:

- a. Fallman will fully and faithfully perform all of the duties of Municipal Court Judge as defined under Chapter 2.25 of the Brookings Municipal Code and as set forth herein and in the attached job description.
- Except as otherwise provided in 2(c) of this Agreement, Fallman shall only perform the duties of Municipal Court Judge in the absence and unavailability of Municipal Court Judge Gary Milliman.
- c. Fallman shall comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws, ordinances, and regulations and faithfully discharge the duties of Municipal Court Judge to the best of his ability.

### 3. Compensation:

- a. For general Municipal Court services and in the absence of Judge Gary Milliman shall receive compensation of \$325.00 per court session.
- 4. <u>Term:</u> The City Council may, by majority vote, terminate this Agreement and relieve Fallman of Municipal Judge duties and responsibilities at its sole discretion upon written notice. Fallman may terminate this Agreement for any reason upon written notice to the City Council.

### 5. General provisions:

- a. This Agreement, including the exhibits, constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties. Each of the exhibits identified in this Agreement is attached hereto and incorporated by this reference.
- b. Any modification or amendment to this Agreement must be made in writing and signed by both parties.

- c. This Agreement is personal to the Parties. Fallman may not assign or delegate his duties hereunder.
- d. This Agreement is executed on behalf of City as authorized by its City Council.
- e. If any legal action or proceeding arising out of or relating to this Agreement is brought by either party to this Agreement, the prevailing party shall be entitled to receive from the other party, in addition to any other relief that may be granted, the reasonable attorneys' fees, costs, and expenses incurred in the action or proceeding by the prevailing party.
- f. This Agreement will be governed and interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of Oregon. Any litigation between the parties under this Agreement or arising out of activities performed under this Agreement must be filed in Curry County Circuit Court or the U.S. District Court for the State of Oregon, as appropriate.

# AGREEMENT FOR SERVICES

between the City of Brookings ("City"), a municipal corporation of the State of Oregon, and James Fallman, Municipal Judge Pro Tem ("Fallman" or "Pro Tem"), collectively referred to herein as the "Parties."

### **RECITALS**

- 1. The City seeks to enter into a contractual agreement with Fallman for the provision of Municipal Judge Pro Tem services.
- 2. Fallman has served the City in the capacity of Pro Tem since April 20, 2006.
- 3. Fallman desires to continue to provide Pro Tem services as defined herein.

## **NOW THEREFORE**, the Parties agree as follows:

### TERMS OF AGREEMENT:

1. Contract for services: The City contracts with James Fallman for Municipal Judge Pro Tem services for the City of Brookings.

### 2. Duties of Municipal Judge Pro Tem:

The Pro Tem for the City of Brookings shall:

- a. Fully and faithfully perform all duties of Municipal Judge Pro Tem as defined under Chapter 2.25 of the Brookings Municipal Code, and the duties and performance responsibilities as set forth in Exhibit "A", incorporated herein by attachment.
- b. Comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, ordinances, and regulations and faithfully discharge, to the best of his ability, the duties of the
- c. Perform such other duties as may be assigned by the City Council from time to time.
- 3. Compensation: Beginning January 1, 2015, services will be compensated at the rate of \$200 per each Brookings Municipal Court session at which Pro Tem presides.
- 4. Term: Pro Tem acknowledges that the City Council may, by majority vote, terminate this Agreement and relieve him of any and all Pro Tem duties and responsibilities, for any reason and with or without notice. City acknowledges that Pro Tem may also terminate this Agreement for any reason with or without notice. City Council shall review Pro Tem's performance and this Agreement, annually.

### 5. Status as Independent Contractor:

a. The City and Pro Tem enter this Agreement with the understanding that Pro Tem will not be an officer or employee of the City, but rather will serve as an independent

- contractor. As such, Pro Tem acknowledges that he will not be eligible to receive employee benefits, including, but not limited to: social security, worker's compensation and unemployment benefits.
- b. The City will not control the day-to-day activities and administration of justice by Pro Tem.
- c. Pro Tem hereby releases, acquits, and forever discharges City from any claims made by Pro Tem, available to him now or in the future, that he is other than an independent contractor.
- d. Pro Tem will indemnify, defend and hold the City harmless against any and all damages, costs, fees or expenses (including attorneys' fees) that he may have against the City arising from service to the City, except as otherwise set forth in this Agreement and excepting claims arising from a negligent act of the City.

### 6. General Provisions:

# **General Statement of Duties:**

The Municipal Judge Pro Tem is a judicial officer of the City of Brookings and will preside over the Municipal Court of the City of Brookings in the absence of the Municipal Judge.

# **Distinguishing Features:**

The Municipal Judge Pro Tem shall have authority to issue process for the arrest of any person accused of an offense against the ordinances of the City of Brookings and of traffic crimes as defined by ORS 801.545; to commit any such person to jail or admit any such person to bail pending trial; to compel witnesses to appear and testify in Court on the trail of any cause before the Court; to issue subpoenas; to compel obedience to such subpoenas; to issue any process necessary to carry in effect the judgments of the Court; and to punish witnesses for contempt of court.

# **Supervision Received:**

The Municipal Judge Pro Tem works under the supervision of the City Council. The Municipal Judge Pro Tem is appointed and may be removed by a majority vote of the City Council.

## **Jurisdiction:**

All of the incorporated area, now or hereafter, within the City of Brookings shall be within the territorial jurisdiction of the Municipal Court and Municipal Judge Pro Tem.

### **Supervision Exercised:**

No employees are supervised by the Municipal Judge Pro Tem.



### SIGNIFICANT CASES HANDLED

I have 2 published wins and 1 published loss in the Nevada Supreme Court. I won reversals in both the 1st & 3rd Dist. California Courts of Appeal including the criminal case of <u>Bigger Thomas v. State of California</u> and the workers' compensation case of <u>Westbrooks v. Greyhound Lines</u>. I have published cases in most of California's appellate courts and 2 published opinions in the 9th Circuit U.S. Court of Appeals. I lost a case in the U.S. Supreme Court. I tried 10 murder cases and roughly 30 attempted murder cases including <u>People v. Evans</u> where an inmate attempted to stab defense lawyer Leroy Davies in the heart. I was assigned to 2 death penalty prison cases at the Del Norte D.A.'s Office. I was assigned to 1 death penalty appellate case while working at the California State Public Defender's Office in Sacramento. I handled one murder case in Nevada.

I have tried over 200 jury trials over a 46+ year career. I won a 1st degree murder conviction in Crescent City in People v. Alfred Ayers. I won a 1st degree murder conviction + 3 strikes & conspiracy to commit murder in the prison Aryan Brotherhood gang case of People v. Scott Grizzle. I won a 2nd degree murder conviction against a Pelican Bay, reputed Aryan-brotherhood member in People v. Gary Littrell. I convicted an inmate of escape from Pelican Bay + 3 strikes. As a defense attorney I won "not-guilty" on all 28 counts of child molesting in the Sacramento case of People v Jimeno. In Sacramento, I also won "not guilty" on 4 counts of manslaughter in a juventile case. I won the 4 count sexual assault jury trial of Peo. v. Tiedemann in 2013. I also tried the murder cases of People v. Brian Healy and People v. Contretas. I convicted "Clever" Sanchez of attempted murder, conspiracy to riot at Pelican Bay State Prison. In 2020 I defended the murder case of Pedro Ramirez, and in 2021 I defended the murder case of Edward Culver Hughes.

I have passed 5 bar exams, never failing a bar exam, passing the Nevada bar on the 1st attempt in 1974; California on the 1st attempt in 1975 and Montana on the 1st attempt in 1988. I passed the California Criminal Law Specialist bar exam on 1st attempt in 1995 and the Tolowa Nation bar exam on the 1st attempt in 2010. I was admitted to the bar of the U.S. Supreme Court in 1977.

I handled small claims trials for 10 years in the 1980s for the Sacramento Municipal Court. I was the Judge Pro Tem for the Yolo Superior Court in the 1980s handling overflow cases for 3 months until the regular Judge James Stevens could be sworn in. I was the Judge Pro Tem of the Brookings Municipal Court for many years, and I am in my 12th year as the Municipal Judge of the City of Gold Beach.
