### Recommended Motion:

Authorize the City Manager to sign I Play Safety Surfacing change order in the amount of \$28,536 for additional material required for the soft floor system at Kidtown in Azalea Park.

### **Financial Impact:**

\$28,536 from Capital Projects Reserve Fund.

### Background/Discussion:

During the construction of the new Kidtown, it was determined that there was a discrepancy in square footage inside the fence line. The original drawings of Kidtown identified the square footage to be 9400 square feet. During construction of the new play-structure it was determined that the fence line was altered during the original build and additional square footage was added. Rich Roberts from Roberts & Associates Land Surveying verified the square footage inside the fence line to be 10,750 square feet, requiring more material to complete the soft floor system.

BOEM letter in opposition to Off-shore Wind Energy.

### Recommended Motion:

Authorize City Manager to submit letter in opposition to BOEM's proposal for off-shore Wind Energy off the Southern Oregon Coast.

### Financial Impact:

No direct financial impact at this time.

### Background/Discussion:

BOEM Announced a 60-day public comment period on two draft Wind Energy Areas (WEA) located in the existing Call Areas offshore Southern Oregon (Brookings and Coos Bay).

Council discussed at the September 5, 2023 Workshop. BOEM held virtual meetings on September 18<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup>, and held in person meetings in Gold Beach on September 26<sup>th</sup>, in Coos Bay on September 27<sup>th</sup>, and in Brookings on September 28<sup>th</sup>.

Deputy Public Works and Development Services Director Lauri Ziemer attended the BOEM informational meeting at SWOCC's Curry Campus on September 28<sup>th</sup>. Of those who spoke at the meeting, the overwhelming majority spoke in opposition to the proposed off-shore wind energy. Primary concerns were:

- Impact to the commercial fishing industry and displacing fishermen.
- Impact on tourism; windmill farms are aesthetically unpleasing and will ruin the Oregon Coast ocean view.

- Placement of the giant turbines and anchors and the overall impacts to the environment, wildlife habitat, endangered marine species and irreparable harm caused to seabirds, marine mammals, fisheries management.
- What benefit to the South Coast? Windmill project will benefit areas inland.
- Installation of the windmills may impact the Cascadia earthquake zone and cause major earthquake and irreplicable damage.
- Windmills to be leased to out-of-state, out-of-country entities who will make the most profit at southern Oregon taxpayer expense and livelihood. Those profits will not benefit us but be funneled overseas.
- When windmill leases go belly up, who maintains and dismantles windmills. As seen in other places the windmill farms fall into disrepair and are abandoned with no one removing them.
- Noise constantly generated could affect behavior of fish, whales, and birds.
- Electro-magnetic fields impact fish/whale navigation, predator detection, and communication.
- Decision will be made by government officials who have no concern on impact on southern Oregon residents.
- Exploiting rural economically-strapped areas, like Coos and Curry counties.

I have taken the concerns heard from City Council, stakeholders, and other interested citizens, and drafted the attached letter. Comments are due by October 16, 2023. Based on your previous input, I am looking for your approval to submit a letter/comments prior to that deadline.

The City Council of Brookings recently met and heard from stakeholders regarding offshore wind energy.

The City is concerned with the proposal to deploy offshore wind energy development off the Southern Oregon Coast. Two areas have been identified as Wind Energy Areas (WEA) offshore southern Oregon with their closest points ranging from approximately 18-32 miles off the coast. Our community and others along the Oregon Coast are concerned with the:

- Impact to the commercial fishing industry and displacing fishermen.
- Impact on tourism; windmill farms are aesthetically unpleasing and will ruin the Oregon Coast ocean view.
- Placement of the giant turbines and anchors and the overall impacts to the environment, wildlife habitat, endangered marine species and irreparable harm caused to seabirds, marine mammals, fisheries management.
- Installation of the windmills may impact the Cascadia earthquake zone and cause major earthquake and irreplicable damage.
- Windmills to be leased to out-of-state, out-of-country entities who will make the most profit at southern Oregon taxpayer expense and livelihood. Those profits will not benefit us but be funneled overseas.
- The cost of maintenance and dismantling, if needed, when the windmills fall into disrepair and are abandoned with no one removing them.
- Noise constantly generated could affect behavior of fish, whales, and birds.
- Electro-magnetic fields impact fish/whale navigation, predator detection, and communication.

### **RESOLUTION 22-R-1232**

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF BROOKINGS TO SEND THE BUREAU OF OCEAN ENERGY MANAGEMENT (BOEM) AND THE OREGON DEPARTMENT OF ENERGY (ODOE) A LETTER WITH RECOMMENDATIONS REGARDING OFFSHORE WIND ENERGY.

WHEREAS, the Brookings City Council (Council) supports responsible and sustainable economic development projects which benefit the citizens of our community; and

WHEREAS, the Council recognizes renewable energy is an important part of Oregon and the nation's energy portfolio, and we appreciate the efforts that are being made to make our energy system more resilient and diversified; and

WHEREAS, the Council recognizes our commercial and recreational fishing fleets are a critical component of the economy of the Oregon Coast, and we are deeply concerned about potential impacts on this industry; and

WHEREAS, the Council believes certain steps should be taken to ensure that existing ocean users and stakeholders are protected in the process;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED the Council requests the following considerations in order to ensure that our current ocean users, stakeholders, and marine life are protected:

- 1. The offshore leasing process needs to be transparent and inclusive. We would ask that BOEM engage in a more inclusive public process by bringing together stakeholders such as the fishing industry, environmentalists, coastal communities, and local, state, and federal elected officials as equal partners, with an agenda that is created in a collaborative fashion. These stakeholders would be able to review the proposed Call areas and identify areas for concern before the leases are issued.
- 2. Unless the stakeholder group determines otherwise, we assert that the Call areas need to be immediately moved outside of the productive fishery areas. Moving the Call areas outside of 1,300 meters will avoid the majority of the fishing activity.
- 3. Invest in more data to determine the impacts on the marine environment and the potential impacts on marine species, ecosystems, and habitat.
- 4. Provide stakeholders and the public with the potential environmental and economic impacts at the beginning of the process, instead of after the Call areas have been determined. Any community that will be impacted by offshore wind should know and fully understand the impacts before the lease is granted and not after.

The total amount budgeted for community contributions is \$2,500. If Council desires to contribute more than \$2,500, staff could bring back a budget resolution in the future to transfer from contingency.

Subject: Alder Street Parking Lot sidewalk and paving projects

### Recommended Motion:

- 1. Authorize City Manager to sign agreement with Klinefelter Contracting for the Alder Street sidewalk project in the amount of \$74,668.
- 2. Authorize City Manager to sign agreement with Tidewater Contractors Inc. for the Alder Street parking lot paving project to Tidewater Contractors Inc. in the amount of \$59,878.

### Financial Impact:

Total of \$134,546 for both contracts from Urban Renewal capital funds.

### Background/Discussion:

The Alder street Parking Lot was identified as a priority in the 2017 Downtown Master Plan update. The project includes installing curb gutter and sidewalk as well as paving and striping a strip of land along the east edge of Alder Street between Spruce Drive and Spruce Drive. This would provide overflow parking in the downtown area.

Public Works and Parks staff currently mow the lot 3 to 4 times per year. Alder Street in this area was included in the 2022-23 paving projects and a new curb gutter and sidewalk were installed on the west side of Alder Street in 2014.

Staff contacted local contractors to do the work and received the following responses:

Staff recommends awarding the Alder Street Parking Lot project to the low bidders for each portion of project; Tidewater Contractors Inc. for paving, and to Klinefelter Contracting for sidewalks.


