- Consider temporary canopies and layout for events




























The Dalles, Oregon – The Dalles, Oregon – The City of The Dalles invites community members to attend an open house to present and gather feedback on proposed design schemes for the new Federal Street Plaza in downtown The Dalles. The event will take place on Wednesday, February 12, 2024, from 5:30 to 7:00 PM at Freebridge Brewing, located at 710 East 2nd Street, The Dalles, OR.

The City is considering two proposed designs for the new Federal Street Plaza, located on Federal Street between 1st and 2nd Streets. This will require the closure and vacation of Federal Street from 1st to 2nd Streets. The Tony Lot site will not be part of the plaza development but will require future development to complement the plaza.

"We thank those who have been engaged in the process so far. The community has shown strong support for a downtown park or plaza through previous surveys," said City Manager Matthew Klebes. "We're excited to present the two design options and look forward to further feedback to ensure the final design reflects the community's vision."

The Federal Street Plaza project aims to create a vibrant public space that reflects the unique character and needs of The Dalles community. The City has been working with Walker-Macy, a highly regarded consulting firm, to refine design options for the plaza. After presenting five initial schemes to the Federal Street Plaza Committee, the options have been narrowed to two based on public input and committee discussions.

The City is now seeking additional community feedback to help determine the final design. Attendees will have the opportunity to review the two proposed schemes, engage with project representatives and committee members, and share their thoughts to influence the final design.

The two proposed designs are available for preview online at <u>thedalles.org/FSPlaza</u>, along with a link to a comment form for submitting feedback. Posters of the designs will also be displayed at various locations around town. (Specific locations will be announced soon.)

Federal Street Plaza Ad Hoc Committee

The City Council established an ad-hoc committee at its September 9th meeting to guide the development of a proposed downtown plaza on Federal Street, specifically between 1st and 2nd Streets. This project builds on past design concepts and is part of a broader initiative to enhance downtown revitalization and recent improvements.

The committee was formed to further advance the City's Vision Action Plan in key areas:

- Creating Economic Vitality: The plaza is expected to boost downtown vibrancy by enhancing public spaces and supporting the revitalization of nearby historic properties.
- Strengthening and Sustaining Community Life: Envisioned as a gathering hub for community events and cultural activities, the plaza aims to foster a stronger sense of community and celebrate local heritage.

Community engagement has been central to this initiative. A recent survey gathered public input on potential uses for the site cleared by the demolition of Tony's building, with feedback showing strong support for a public plaza.

The ad-hoc committee will provide recommendations on the design, construction, and budget for the project. In addition, the committee will coordinate with City staff to identify and pursue grant opportunities to help fund the plaza.

The committee will meet every other Wednesday beginning September 11, 2024 through February 2025. Meetings take place at 5:30pm on the second floor of City Hall at 313 Court Street.

Following multiple meetings that included presentations, discussions, and time dedicated to hearing public comments, the committee narrowed the options down to two potential schemes. Public input played a crucial role in shaping these remaining options. The committee is now seeking additional public feedback to help determine the final design.

- Engage in meaningful discussions with project representatives and committee members.
- Share your input to influence the final design.
