Purpose of ite	em DEQ and the Oregon Department of Forestry will provide an update on the Oregon Smoke Management Program, Plan and Advisory Committee.		
Background	In May 2017, DEQ and the Oregon Department of Forestry and convened the Smoke Management Review Advisory Committee to explore and make recommendations for improved implementation, policy changes or clarifications to the Oregon Smoke Management Program to better accomplish the program's goals.		
	The goals for the Oregon Smoke Management Program are to improve the use of prescribed burning as a forest management and protection practice, and to minimize emissions from prescribed burning consistent with federal and state air quality objectives. Prescribed forestry burning is the intentional burning of forest fuels under managed conditions to achieve forestland management objectives. The Oregon Smoke Management Program, administered by ODF, works to provide opportunities for prescribed burning while minimizing the amount of harmful smoke that reaches communities, with special emphasis on designated smoke sensitive communities.		
Agency recommenda	tions The Smoke Management Advisory Committee held its last meeting March 9, 2018, to review the draft joint ODF/DEQ proposal for changes to the Smoke Management Program and Plan. The agencies' proposal is based on input from the committee process and seeks to meet the state goals for smoke management.		
	At the May 11 commission meeting, DEQ and ODF will review the draft agencies' proposal and committee feedback. The agencies will		

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	highlight the key decision points for this rulemaking as well as refinements to the proposal.
Next steps	DEQ and ODF will engage in formal rulemaking and jointly hold a public comment process for the final proposals in summer and fall 2018. DEQ and ODF will incorporate committee feedback into final proposed rules for action in fall 2018. The Board of Forestry and EQC must approve the final Smoke Management Plan and program updates.
	The Oregon Smoke Management Program is also part of the Oregon Clean Air Act State Implementation Plan and, if approved, DEQ will submit the approved Plan and Program rules to EPA for inclusion in the Oregon State Implementation Plan.
