2017-19 LEGISLATION

House Bill 2269

- Modifies fee schedule for sources subject to federal operating permit program under Title V of federal Clean Air Act.
- Adds grants and loans for replacements to permissible uses of moneys in Clean Diesel Engine Fund. Makes other modifications to provisions for grants and loans from fund for purpose of reducing emissions from diesel engines.
- Authorizes State of Oregon to receive moneys pursuant to Volkswagen Environmental Mitigation Trust Agreement, deposit agreement moneys in Clean Diesel Engine Fund and use moneys to award grants for reducing emissions from diesel engines. Specifies allocation of grants from agreement moneys.
- Removes requirement that certain rules adopted by Environmental Quality Commission may be applied to specific stationary source only if expressly incorporated as condition in permit.
- Allows assessment of civil penalties for violations of certain motor vehicle emission standards by persons other than motor vehicle owners and their lessees.

House Bill 2268 – Modifies underground storage tank fees to maintain existing program. This fee was last increased in 2007.

Senate Bill 5518 – DEQ's budget bill.

2017-19 SIGNIFICANT BUDGET CHANGES

Package 070: Revenue Shortfalls

Air Quality reductions

- Reductions of 4.0 FTE in Air Quality's ACDP permitting program to bring expenditures in line with revenues. Package 110 requests restoration based on an ACDP fee increase.
- Permanent reductions of 7.0 FTE and \$1,150,000 Other Funds in services and supplies in the Vehicle Inspection program to bring expenditures in line with revenues.

- Permanent reductions of 2.0 FTE and \$70,000 Other Funds in services and supplies costs to balance the Title V air permitting program budget.

Water Quality reductions

- Permanent reductions of 2.0 FTE in groundwater and toxics monitoring to bring expenditures in line with Federal Fund revenues. Package 121 proposed restoration on General Fund but was not recommended in the GRB.
- Permanent reductions of 1.5 FTE in groundwater protection to bring expenditures in line with Federal Fund revenues. Package 121 proposed restoration on General Fund but was not recommended in the GRB.
- Permanent reduction of 1.0 FTE in water quality standards to bring expenditures in line with Federal Fund revenues. Package 122 proposed restoration on General Fund but was not recommended in the GRB.

Land Quality reductions

- Reductions of 2.0 FTE in Land Quality's Underground Storage Tank program to bring expenditures in line with Other Fund revenues. Package 132 requests restoration based on an UST fee increase.
- Permanent reductions of 2.92 FTE in Land Quality's Emergency Response program to bring expenditures in line with Other Fund revenues. Package 134 proposed restoration on General Fund but was not recommended in the GRB.

Package 090: Analyst Adjustments

Package 090 adjustments were designed to achieve a seven percent reduction from modified Current Service Level.

Air Quality reductions

- Reduce funding for Lane Regional Air Protection Agency by 10 percent. The cut in funding would reduce overall services that LRAPA provides for Lane County residents and businesses. (\$26,689 GF reduction)
- Reduce fine particulate monitoring speciation to all but three to four winter months. Speciation identifies the source and composition of fine particulate pollution. DEQ will need approval from EPA to implement this reduction. (\$192,000 GF reduction and 1.0 FTE)
- Reduce emission inventory work which is the scientific underpinning of air quality planning, including identification of sources, determining baseline emission levels, evaluating the benefits of proposed emission reduction strategies and meeting federal technical requirements. This reduction will delay air toxics and fine particulate reduction efforts. (\$122,590 GF reduction and 0.5 FTE) Package 116 [Cleaner Air Oregon] recommends one NRS3 to develop estimates of the amount of air toxics pollution released by industrial facilities.
- Reduce project management support for Air Quality programs. Would reduce project management coordination on projects supported by General Fund including air toxics reduction, clean diesel and clean fuels program updates and enhancements. (\$163,090 GF reduction and 0.5 FTE)

Water Quality reductions

- Reduce on-the-ground guidance and assistance for water quality improvement projects in eastern Oregon, including developing water quality improvement plans, providing technical assistance on the design and implementation of water quality restoration projects, and evaluating effectiveness toward meeting water quality objectives. (\$200,000 GF reduction and 1.0 FTE)
- Reduce support for implementation of Integrated Water Resources Strategy positions, including support for place-based planning efforts, providing water quality expertise for planning water storage and supply projects, and working with other IWRs agencies to align water-related policies and programs. (\$250,000 GF reduction and 2.0 FTE)

- Reduce policy development and technical assistance to agency and local partners to address nonpoint source pollution on forested and agricultural lands, including evaluating and providing feedback on water quality management plans regarding progress toward meeting water quality objectives, and supporting nonpoint source toxics reduction efforts. (\$514,000 GF reduction and 2.0 FTE)
- Reduce DEQ's capacity to analyze groundwater samples and analyze surface water and tissue samples for toxics, resulting in fewer data being collected to guide water quality protection and restoration programs and to inform water users of potential public health threats. (\$387,000 GF reduction and 1.0 FTE; restored 1.0 FTE on \$214,496 LF)
- Reduce a permit writer position that currently specializes in permitting land application of wastewater. This reduction will impact overall permit-writing resources because work will need to be distributed to other permitting specialists, contributing to delays in permit renewals. (\$250,000 GF reduction and 1.0 FTE)
- Reduce policy expertise and strategic planning for compliance and enforcement, limiting DEQ's ability to develop and effectively apply appropriate mechanisms to promote compliance with and deter violations of state regulations. (\$210,828 GF reduction and 1.0 FTE)

Policy Packages - Recommended * *amounts below reflect revenue or General Fund allocations*

Air Quality packages

- **110 – Maintain an Effective ACDP Permit Program (\$1,572,800 Other Funds):** Recommends a fee increase in the Air Contaminant Discharge program sufficient to maintain the program through the 2019-2021 biennium.
- **112 – Enhance Community Engagement and Response (\$530,000 Other Funds, 2.0 FTE. Modified).** Requested \$1.1 million in General Fund and \$418,490 in Other Fund for 7.0 FTE to support DEQ's timely and thorough response to complaints. Modified to support 2.0 FTE with Other Funds through approximate 4% fee increases on ACDP and Title V permits for permitted source complaint response, with the result that odor and air toxics sources can be identified and solutions implemented more quickly and efficiently.
- **113 – Implement Clean Air Oregon Air Toxics Monitoring (\$2.5 million General Fund, 6.76 FTE. Modified).** Originally requested \$3,340,616 for real-time metals monitoring, six air toxics trends sites, 50 particulate monitors and moss studies. Modified to fund the purchase of monitoring equipment and 6.76 FTE to collect and analyze data from six air toxics trend sites and 25 fine particulate monitors in locations throughout the state. This package differs from Package 116 because it only focuses on the funding needed for monitoring activities. FTE in package 116 are permit writers, modelers, and source testers.
- **115 – Reduce Diesel Emissions To Improve Public Health (\$10,350,787 Other Funds, 2.50 FTE. Modified).** Requested \$422,860 (1.0 FTE) General Fund and \$10,255,537 Other Fund (1.50 FTE). Modified to shift all positions and funding to Other Funds to develop administrative rules and to implement an award program to distribute \$68.2 million in Volkswagen settlement funds that are restricted to reducing diesel emissions.
- **116 – Implement Cleaner Air Oregon Risk-Based Air Permitting (\$130,529 General Fund and \$2,710,200 Other Funds).** This package advances Cleaner Air Oregon in a different way that Policy Package 113, but the goal is to reduce public health risks arising from air pollution. Recommends funding to implement risk-based permitting for certain industrial sources of air toxics to protect public health. FTE will include permit writer, modelers, and source testers.

Water Quality packages

- **120 – Minimizing Impacts from Urban Stormwater (\$480,209 Other Funds. Modified).** Originally requested a combination of General Fund and Other Funds to support 4.0 FTE to enable DEQ to fulfill its regulatory responsibilities to protect water quality by issuing permits to minimize pollutants in stormwater runoff from urban areas. Modified to remove General Fund and 2.0 FTE from package.
- **125 – Water Quality Permit Program Improvements (\$500,000 General Fund and \$214,286 Other Funds, 3.27 FTE. Modified).** Originally requested \$249,496 in General Fund for 1.0 FTE. Modified the package to add

additional General Fund and FTE, and partially fund the package on Other Funds. The new positions support permit program improvements by establishing four new positions to develop and implement integrated information management procedures and reporting systems. [GRB does not include Other Fund revenues; DEQ plans to request a technical adjustment.]

- **181/191 – Clean Water State Revolving Fund (\$30 million and \$10 million Non-Limited Funds).** Recommends limitation to provide \$30 million of additional CWSRF loans using the federal capitalization grant monies DEQ expects to receive during the biennium. Also recommends non-limited expenditure approval to fund \$150,000 of bond issuance costs associated with bonds issued to provide the state match component of up to three federal capitalization grants, and limitation to provide \$10 million debt service for the bonds.

Land Quality packages

- **131 – Implement Materials Management 2050 Vision (Other Funds limitation).** Recommends limitation to support continued implementation of Materials Management 2050 Vision for sustainable materials management, including a reduction in materials impact and food waste. Revenue was approved in 1517. Includes increased funding (\$1.65 million) in professional service and grants to local governments and others.
- **132 – Maintain an Effective Underground Storage Tanks Inspection Program (\$1.7 million Other Funds).** Recommends a fee increase to continue underground storage tank inspection program.
- **135 – Orphan Site Cleanups (Other Fund limitation).** Recommends bonding in package 183 to support the cleanup of sites where parties responsible for the pollution are unknown, unable or unwilling to perform cleanup related work.
- **136 – Lead Paint Task Force (\$50,000 General Fund).** Recommends funding to support a task force on reducing exposure to lead paint in coordination with Oregon Health Authority.
- **162 – Portland Harbor (\$10 million bonding Non-Limited debt service).** Recommends lottery bond package for early clean-up actions in Portland Harbor, including long-term monitoring systems. Funds to be transferred to Business Oregon for expenditure.
- **183/193 – Clean Up Contaminated Orphan Sites: Bonds (\$10.3 million Non-Limited Funds).** Recommends General Fund bond sales of \$10 million and an expenditure limitation to pay for bond issuance costs associated with bond sales that support the cleanup of contaminated orphan sites.

Agency Management packages

- **161 – Environmental Data Management System (\$7.68 million in bonding authority and \$350,748 in General Fund).** Supports the development of an environmental data management system that will provide interactive service to the public and stakeholders, while also standardizing and streamlining agency internal business practices.

Policy Packages – Not Recommended

- **114 – Reduce Wood Smoke Emissions.** Requested \$100,000 in General Fund to increase funding to aid local programs to curtail wood smoke reduction.
- **121 – Toxics Monitoring and Groundwater Assessment/Protection.** Requested \$991,080 to restore 4.0 FTE for toxics monitoring, groundwater monitoring and statewide groundwater quality policy leadership and interagency coordination.
- **122 – Setting Water Quality Standards.** Requested \$257,898 in general Fund to restore 1.0 FTE for water quality standards revisions.
- **123 – Harmful Algae Bloom Response and Assessment.** Requested \$694,480 in General Fund for 3.0 FTE to monitor, sample and analyze harmful algae blooms.
- **134 – Statewide Emergency Preparedness and Response.** Requested \$2 million in General Fund for 7.38 FTE for safe management and cleanup of oil and other hazardous material releases.
- **141 – Content Management.** Requested \$179,278 Other Funds for 1.0 FTE to manage DEQ's website content.
- **142 – Information Security Analyst.** Requested \$235,970 Other Funds for 1.0 FTE to improve DEQ's capacity to identify and address threats to the security of its computers and computer systems.
