Background Information – Federal AQ Regulations

- Why adopt Federal AQ Regulations into Oregon law?
 - Oregon has adopted most if not all federal AQ regulations
 - Public benefit DEQ in a better position to ensure that emission reductions are achieved in Oregon
 - Benefit to affected businesses –technical assistance and quicker applicability determinations and approval of alternative compliance demonstrations







National Emission Standards Performance Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants (NESHAP)

EPA Adoption

Apply upon EPA adoption



Emission Guidelines

EPA Adoption Do not apply upon EPA adoption

State Adoption/Implementation

Apply upon state adoption or adoption of federal plan

Proposed Rules Adopt new federal standards

Wool Fiberglass Manufacturing (AS NESHAP)

Proposed Rules – Adopt rules to implement amended federal emission guidelines



Commercial/Industrial
Solid Waste Incinerators



Proposed rules: adopt by reference – amended federal standards

- NESHAPs (examples):
 - Electric arc furnaces steelmaking facilities
 - Electric utility steam generating units
 - Industrial/commercial/industrial boilers
 - Portland cement plants
 - Secondary aluminum production

- NSPSs (examples):
 - Electric utility steam generating units
 - Portland cement plants

Public Outreach

- No advisory committee:
 - Federal AQ regulations adopted by reference
 - Fiscal impact occurred when EPA adopted regulations
- Public comments:
 - EPA:
 - commented on the proposed rules;
 - DEQ agreed and made the necessary changes
 - Industry rep:
 - "we support state adoption of the federal rule changes to keep Oregon's air quality program current with federal standards"

Summary

- This rulemaking proposes adoption of:
 - New federal AQ standards
 - Amended federal AQ standards
 - Adoption of rules and approval of state plan to implement amended federal emission guidelines for commercial and industrial solid waste incineration units

DEQ Recommendation

- Adopt the proposed permanent rules in Attachment A as part of chapter 340 of the Oregon Administrative Rules.
- Approve the state plan to implement amended federal emission guidelines for commercial and industrial solid waste incineration units in Attachment B; and
- Direct DEQ to submit the state plan and delegation requests to the EPA for approval.
