Why this is important

Under Oregon's Administrative Procedures Act, ORS Chapter 183, parties are entitled to challenge certain DEQ orders, penalties or other enforcement actions through a contested case hearing process that will result in a final order from the agency and commission. It is important that modifications to the appeal and review process be fully evaluated to ensure that they are fair, efficient and

effective.

Background

At the June 2015 meeting, at the commission's request, DEQ staff presented an information session and discussion on the issue of whether the EQC should change its role in the contested case hearing process. Commissioners raised some questions requiring follow-up, and during the October 2015 meeting, DEQ staff presented information in response to those questions. One specific set of questions related to whether the EQC could create a subpanel to focus on review of the record in contested cases. The commissioners then asked for a proposed procedure for using a subpanel. At the December meeting, DEQ will provide the EQC with a proposed procedure and questions for discussion and

decision.

Next steps and commission involvement

DEQ asks the commissioners for feedback on the information presented, with the goal of finalizing a decision on whether and how a subpanel would be used.



BEFORE HEARING



Decisions needed:

Whether to use the subpanel

- After receiving materials, Chair decides case-by-case, or
- Subpanel is default

Who is on the subpanel

- Chair assigns subpanel members case-by-case, or
- Subpanel members are assigned on a pre-set rotating basis
