- Overall feasibility of the program




Update Carbon Intensities

Oregon Clean Fuels Standards






Feasibility of the Program

E10 and B5 for baseline

Changes to carbon intensities

Lack of lower carbon fuels





Provide Additional Flexibility to Comply

Extended 3-year (2016 – 2018) compliance period for importers of finished fuels

Small deficit (less than 10%) carry over to following compliance period

Carry back period – extra quarter to acquire credits

Initial 2-year (2016 – 2017) compliance period for largest fuel importers



Implement SB 324(2015)

More small businesses are exempt from complying with the standards – 500,000 gallons per year

Additional exemptions – fuel used in construction equipment, locomotives & watercraft

Additional cost containment mechanisms



Streamline Process to Participate in the Program

Adjust CARB-approved carbon intensity

Tier 1 and Tier 2 calculators

Default carbon intensities

CFP Online System

GHG Reporting System - EZ Fuels



Establish Enforcement Criteria

- Failure to register
- Failure to keep records
- Failure to submit reports
- Failure to meet the clean fuel standards
