Hi Nicole,

We are submitting the attached documents on behalf of the City of Newberg regarding their request for ODOT X-Permit associated with the City water line relocations. 


### **MISCELLANEOUS**



- 45. If the Applicant impacts a legally protected/regulated resource, Applicant shall be responsible for all costs associated with such impact, including, but not limited to all costs of mitigation and rehabilitation, and shall indemnify, and hold ODOT harmless for such impacts and be responsible and liable to ODOT for any associated costs or claims that ODOT may have.
- Plans are reviewed by ODOT in general only and do not relieve the Applicant from completing roadway improvements in a manner satisfactory to ODOT. The District Manager or representative may require field changes. When revisions are made in the field, Applicant is responsible to provide "as built" drawings, within 60 days from completion of roadway improvements, and shall submit them to the District Office issuing the permit.
- Applicant shall be responsible for locating and preserving all existing survey monumentation within the work area in accordance with ORS 209.150 and/or 209.155. If monumentation or its accessories are inadvertently or otherwise disturbed or destroyed, Applicant shall be responsible for all costs and coordination associated with its reestablishment by a professional licensed surveyor.
- 48. Applicant shall be responsible to restore or replace any curbs or curb ramps damaged by the permitted activity according to ODOT's ADA Standards available at <a href="https://www.oregon.gov/ODOT/Engineering/Pages/Accessibility.aspx.">https://www.oregon.gov/ODOT/Engineering/Pages/Accessibility.aspx.</a>. - When constructing a minor roadway improvement, Applicant shall comply with all federal, state, and local laws, regulations, executive orders and ordinances applicable to the work under this permit, including, without limitation, the provisions of ORS 276.071. If Applicant chooses to assign their permitted responsibilities to a consultant or contractor, Applicant shall inform the consultant or contractor of the requirements of ORS 276.071.
- Upon completion of the permitted minor roadway improvement, Applicant shall notify ODOT and request final inspection. If all structures and appurtenances constructed under this permit are found to be in compliance with permit provisions and state standards, ODOT will accept ownership of the permitted structures and appurtenances by written notice to the Applicant.







# Highway Mile Posts Highway Mile Point - Hundredths Highway Network





## "X" PERMIT SPECIAL PROVISIONS FOR

# UTILITIES WITH A COMPENSABLE INTEREST OR A PRIOR RIGHT EASEMENT HOLDING

- 2. The Oregon Transportation Commission agrees to reimburse the Applicant the costs Applicant incurs in removing or relocating the facilities detailed in this X Permit in the event such removal or relocation is required at any future time by the Oregon Transportation Commission.
- 3. Oregon Administrative Rule 734-055-0017 shall not apply to this X Permit.
- 4. Oregon Administrative Rule 734-055-0020(2) and (3) shall not apply to this X Permit.
- 5. Oregon Administrative Rule 734-055-0025(1) shall not apply to this X Permit. The applicant shall, however, be responsible and liable for all damage or injury to any person or property resulting from the applicant's negligence in connection with the physical location, installation, construction, maintenance, operation or use of the applicant's facility or operations for which applicant has been granted this X Permit. The applicant shall indemnify and hold harmless the State of Oregon, the Oregon Transportation Commission, and the Oregon Department of Transportation against any and all damages, claims, demands, actions, causes of action, costs and expenses of whatsoever nature which the State of Oregon, the Oregon Transportation Commission, or the Oregon Department of Transportation may sustain by reasons of the negligent acts, conduct, or operations of applicant, applicant's agents or applicant's employees in connection with the physical location, installation, construction, maintenance, repair, operation or use of the applicant's facility.
- 6. Oregon Administrative Rule 734-055-0025(2) shall not apply to this X Permit.
- 7. Oregon Administrative Rule 734-055-0025(3) shall not apply to this X Permit, however, the Department of Transportation of the State of Oregon, the Chief Engineer, and Department of Transportation employees shall not be responsible or liable for injury or damage that may occur to the facilities detailed in this X Permit resulting from motorist or road user operations.
- 8. Oregon Administrative Rule 734-055-0045(1) shall not apply to this X Permit.
- 9. Oregon Administrative Rule 734-055-0045(4) shall apply to this X Permit, however, the applicant shall not pay the costs of removal or relocation of the applicant's facilities covered by this X Permit. Such costs of removal or relocation shall instead be the responsibility of the Oregon Transportation Commission.
- 10. The rights and privileges granted to the applicant pursuant to this X Permit shall not be changed or

abrogated pursuant to Oregon Administrative Rule 734-055-0060(5) without compensating the applicant in accordance with the takings provisions of the United States Constitution, Amendment V and the Oregon Constitution, Article I, Section 18.

- 11. Oregon Administrative Rule 734-055-0025(9) shall apply to this X Permit, however, the Applicant shall not pay the costs of the inspection set forth in Oregon Administrative Rule 734-055-0025(9).
- 12. In the event the Oregon Transportation Commission requires the Applicant's removal or relocation of the facilities described in this X Permit, the Oregon Transportation Commission shall provide written notice to the Applicant one hundred and eighty (180) days before such removal or relocation must be accomplished.
