Why this is important

The commissioners will have the opportunity to tour a wetland designed and engineered for wastewater treatment and learn about the project's benefits for water quality, recreation and environmental education. The project was designed in response to DEQ regulations that required cooler temperatures of treated wastewater going back into the Willamette River.

Background Talking Water Gardens opened to the public in March 2012 and has

received many awards for its planning and implementation. It is a wastewater treatment system that uses natural treatment, in the form of an engineered wetland, to remove pollutants from and cool wastewater. The project is the first of its kind nationally, and is a partnership between the Albany-Millersburg municipal treatment system and ATI Wah Chung

industrial treatment system.

EQC involvement

No action is requested. City of Albany staff will lead the 90-minute tour, and commissioners will have opportunities to learn more about the project and its benefits.
