Why this is important

The Oregon Departments of Forestry and Environmental Quality both have responsibilities to protect the quality of Oregon's water. This presentation from the two agency directors will outline what those responsibilities are, how the two agencies interact and how the agencies can help each other achieve improved regulatory and environmental outcomes. This presentation is an updated version from one created in

2011.

Background The Oregon Legislative Assembly charged both DEQ and Forestry with

certain water quality regulatory authorities, and those parallel authorities have occasionally created an uncertain regulatory environment for landowners and stewards in Oregon. This presentation was created to explain where and how the two agencies have complementary authorities, and how the differences in agency policies align or unbalance depending

on the specific situation.
