Purpose of item

This item will inform the commission about the completion of the City of Portland's Big Pipe project, a 20-year endeavor to control and reduce combined sewer overflows at

outfalls on the Columbia and Willamette Rivers in Portland.

Background In 1991, the commission and the city entered into a legal agreement through a

stipulation and final order that established the framework for a twenty-year combined sewer overflow control program that would drastically reduce overflow frequency

and volume. The agreement was amended in 1994.

As part of the final amended stipulation and order, the commission approved Portland's post-2011 Combined Sewer Overflow Facilities Plan in February 2011.

EQC involvement

At the Dec. 15, 2011, EQC meeting, staff from the City of Portland Bureau of Environmental Services will present an overview of the combined sewer overflow program, discuss milestones in the project, explain plans for future control of combined sewer overflows and share a video about the process and successes of the project. As the state's policy body for water quality, the commission has ultimate oversight over the project, and the completion of the project is a major environmental success for Oregon.
