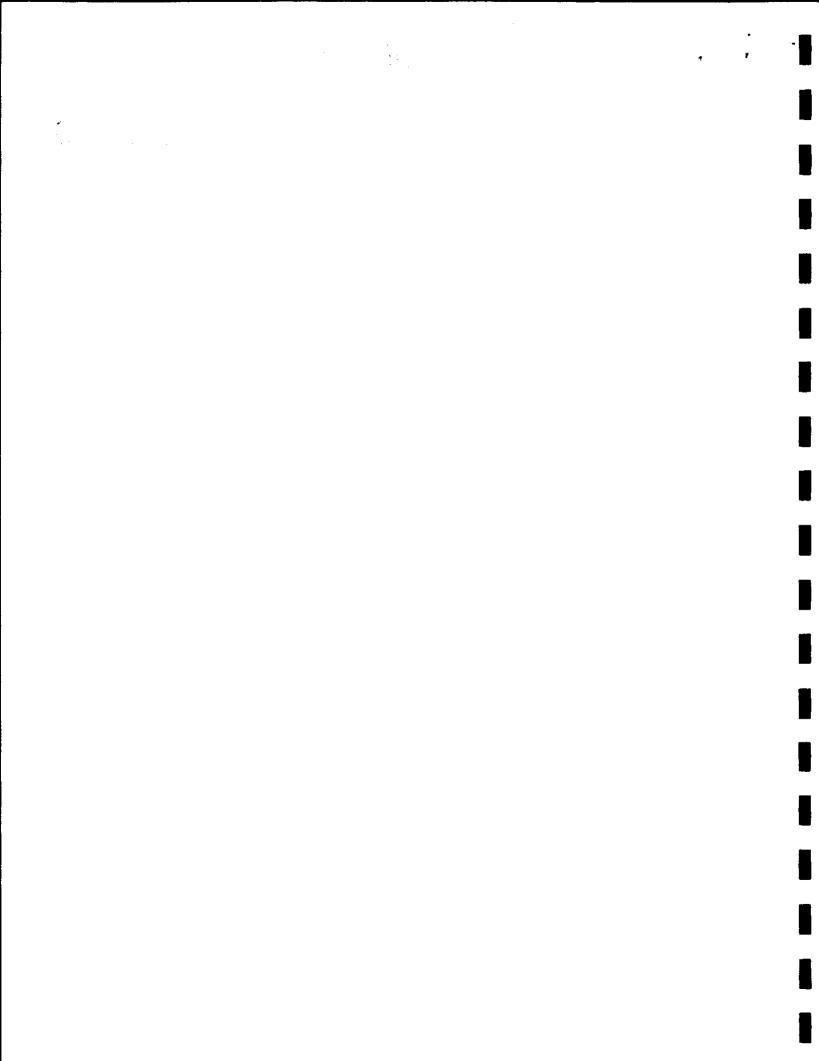
Applicant's Proposal: To dredge 15,000 cubic yards, cut 37,300 cubic yards and fill 33,800 cubic yards in order to create Cathedral Park under the east end of the St. Johns Bridge. The applicant has submitted "Planning Concepts" for the entire project area as well as a more detailed plan for Phase I of the project including the necessary cuts, fills, bank arrangement and additions (attached).

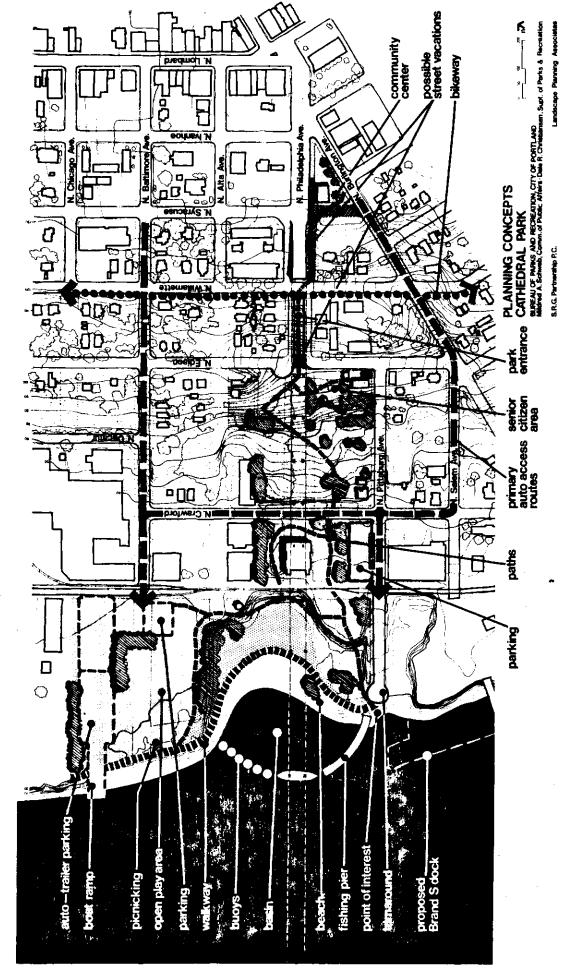
The applicant's Phase I 13.88 acres Park plan indicates:

- -60 space auto-trailer parking facility near the north end of the site
- -a 24 space auto parking lot south of N. Baltimore extended within the site
- -an 18 space auto parking lot just east of the Phase I site north of N. Pittsburg Avenue
- -a boat ramp and associated floating dock near the north property line
- -picnicking, open play area, to be elevated above flood levels north of the Bridge right-of-way
- -2 walkways generally parallel to the shoreline connecting the parking facilities with other park facilities
- -the construction of a 160 sq. ft. restroom in the northerly portion of the site
- -a fishing dock composed of a floating dock to be located south of the Bridge right-of-way

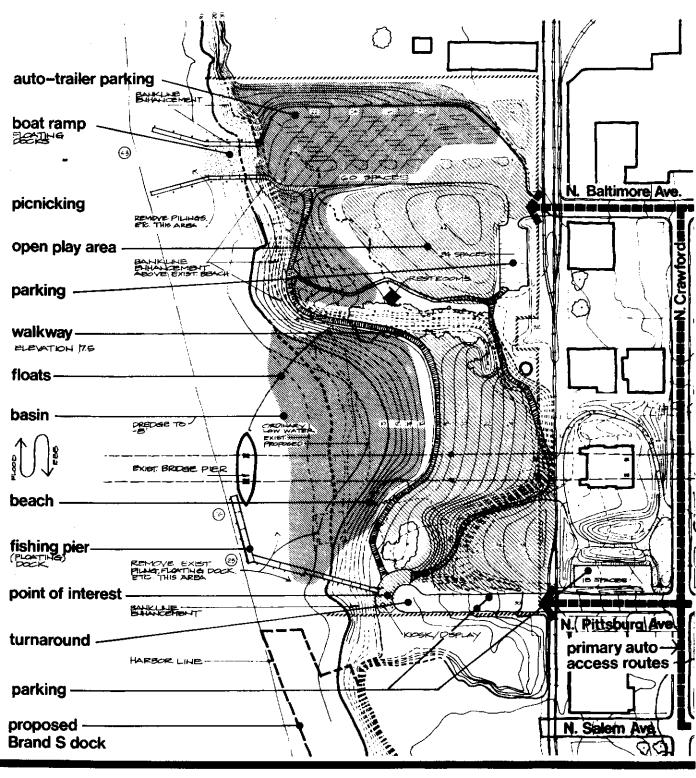
The applicant's plan indicates dredging in the beach area under the bridge in order to increase the river surface area (swimming area) and the creation of a gentle grade up to the railroad tracks in an area currently a flat paved parking lot.

The northerly portion of the site will be lowered for inclusion in the site with a 10 ft. to 15 ft. hill created west of N. Baltimore Avenue. The applicant has included a proposal for river bank enhancement and landscaping.





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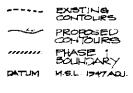
## PHASE 1 MASTER PLAN CATHEDRAL PARK

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The City Council denied an appeal to approve the request.

The surrounding neighborhood is zoned R5, single-family residential. Kennedy Elementary School is three blocks to the west. John Adams High School is three blocks to the east, and Fernhill Park is three blocks to the northeast.

Recommendation: Denial. The site is over built at the present time. There is sufficient space within the existing structure to remodel for a dining area.

### CU 37-75

Findings: Day care centers are regulated by Conditional Use in an R10 zone. There are adequate parking and loading facilities. There are two play areas; one is enclosed by a fence, the other is an adjacent grassy area with children's equipment for those children physically able to use the toys.

On August 10, 1971, the Planning Commission approved P.C. File CU 53-71, a Conditional Use request by the applicant for a day care center for a maximum of 20 children.

The church is located on a 2.86 acre site on a dead-end street. To the south are residential dwellings zoned R10. To the north and west is limited development, and a rest home is to the east of the site. To the east are Pendleton Park and Hayhurst School.

Recommendation: Approval with the condition that all City and State requirements are met.

### CU 38-75

Findings: The adopted 1959 St. John's area plan indicates industrial uses for this area as well as a proposed major street north of the St. John's Bridge from N. Crawford to N. Baltimore. The plan indicates N. Crawford south of the Bridge as an existing major street.

Fills and excavations (dredging) along the Willamette River are regulated by the "Lower Willamette River Management Plan." See attached guidelines for this area. Parks and associated uses are indicated as preferred uses.

The Corps of Engineers is processing this request for dredging and filling to shoreline or riverbank realignment. (071-0YA-1-001852)

Parks are a group 5 permitted use in Ml and MlS zones.

ORS 227.090(2) Powers and Duties of Commission include "Recommend to the City Council...plans for regulation of the future growth ...in respect to...parks...."

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The St. Johns Bridge is an historical landmark. The Design staff has anticipated the possibility of design review procedure for this request.

On April 23, 1975, a joint Landmarks Commission-Design Committee met with the applicant in a preliminary review of the Cathedral Park concept. Both groups unanimously endorsed the planning concept of the St. Johns Cathedral Park as presented "subject to Landmark Commission and Design Committee review at a later date pertaining to each group's interest."

The City Engineer's Office, Rights-of-way Section, is processing street vacations for this project.

To the north and east is the St. Johns portion of Portland. To the south and west is the Willamette River with the St. Johns Bridge above the site. A railroad line runs to the east of the Phase I development and would be surrounded by park when the park is fully developed. There are industrial uses along the river front and commercial and residential uses at a higher elevation.

Recommendation: Amendment to the St. Johns Plan for inclusion of the entire proposed park area to be changed from industrial to recreation use and elimination of arterial notation adjacent to the Bridge west of N. Burlington Avenue; and approval of the Master Plan and Phase I with the following conditions:

- The applicant shall work with the Landmarks Commission to ensure compatibility with their preservation efforts and with the Design Committee, especially pertaining to but not limited to the landscaping, riverbank enhancement, structural design and parking facilities.
- The applicant shall work with the City Traffic Engineer, City Engineer, especially street departments, sewer department and right-of-way section, the Water Bureau and other agencies which have an interest/jurisdiction in this area.

### CU 40-75

Findings: This request is within the Corbett-Terwilliger Neighborhood. Draft II-Land Use and Density indicates the following for this area:

- "-Retain heavy industry
  - -Encourage Development of Environmental Standards
  - -Include this area in a design zone to protect industry from future incompatible land uses
  - -Encourage clean-up of river banks"

Explain fully why you consider this conditional use to be in the best
interests of the public and the immediate neighborhood:
Cathedral Park has been a community effort going back four or five years. This
planhas been enthusiastically endorsed by the Cathedral Park Committee in North Portland
as meeting all of their criteria for the needs of the community. In addition, the Park
conforms to the Lower Willamette River Management Plan which is a statement of State
Policy governing waterway alterations in this stretch of the river.
Public access to the waterfront in Portland is severely limited. This is
particularly true in North Portland. As the initial project on the waterfront this park
should set an example for future developments. Through grading and increasing the water surface
an environment will be created that will greatly enhance the superior design quality of the
bridge, and at the same time provide many opportunities for waterfront recreation for a
diverse range of users.
