Spring Greetings from Your Community Mediators!

As we move forward into 2016, the Board and staff of Your Community Mediators wish to again thank the City of Newberg for supporting community mediation and education. Although you weren't able to support us financially in 2015, we very much appreciate our continued partnership in providing effective options to your residents in resolving disputes peacefully.

YCM strives to be as transparent as possible regarding the specific value of services we provide to the City of Newberg. We are proud of how well we leverage your annual contribution to support YCM's team of 30+ dedicated volunteer mediators, coordinated by YCM's executive director, to continue building a "culture of peace" in the Newberg community.

To update the Newberg City Council, we'd like to present the accompanying FY2014-15 Newberg Case Statistical Summary which details the types of Newberg cases served in the past fiscal year, the number of residents served, mediations performed and direct operational/staff expenses associated with those cases.

In addition, the Case Summary outlines the number of hours and dollar value of <u>volunteer mediator time</u>, as determined by the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics, associated with each of those case types. By contrast, paying for <u>the same number hours of service from professional paid mediator time (at \$100-\$150+ per hour) would cost significantly more</u> - and doesn't include hours that would also be billed for case intake, scheduling, office overhead, etc.

Without Your Community Mediators and the City's collaborative support, many Newberg residents needing help with many types of disputes simply could not afford them and would have to do without.

The Case Summary further reflects the resulting \$31,812 Total Case Service Value of our services to Newberg residents in FY2014-15; that total value amount was reduced by 17% - the value of donated volunteer mediator time.

The Summary further shows that the final Case Value Supported by City of Newberg funds <u>utilized 37% of Your Community Mediators' budget</u> during our fiscal year.

Under the dotted line in the Summary is our current fiscal year's program Budget upon which we are basing our 2016 Funding Request. In the darker box near the bottom right we have again noted the reduction of hard service costs by the anticipated County contribution income based on the County's contribution last year.

For 2016, we are <u>requesting Program Support in the amount of \$22,115</u> to continue to ensure that Newberg residents have full access to YCM's valuable range of services.

<u>In addition</u> to mediating and facilitating various types of community, family and small claims issues, our volunteers

- Provide weekly conflict resolution classes to youth at the County Juvenile Detention Center,
- Hold annual Basic Mediation Trainings to increase the public roster of trained conflict resolution "specialists," and
- Make **educational presentations** to groups whenever possible.

Please ask if you'd like a presentation for a City department meeting, service club, etc..

This year we are continuing to develop our **School Truancy Mediation Program** and to hold regular **Family Meeting Workshops** to help family members learn how to better communicate with each other more skillfully and effectively. <u>Please refer families</u> to us that you think would benefit from this experience (\$25 per family fee, scholarships available)

SPECIAL NOTE: In following the lead of some of our more progressive community mediation center colleagues in Oregon and elsewhere, this year we are asking our city government partners to consider adopting an alternate structure for providing YCM program support.

And that is using a "Contract for Services" which would place YCM separate from the "outside agencies" category and into a services category where we feel we more appropriately belong. As you may already know, nearly half of all community dispute resolution centers - in Oregon and nationally - are actually integrated within their city or county governments as departments or internal agencies.

We've provided an example of the current City of Beaverton-City of Tigard services contract for your review, and would be pleased to discuss this concept further for future years' consideration.

We're excited about the advance of effective conflict resolution in the Newberg community, look forward to a more in-depth discussion with you in the weeks ahead about our continued collaboration to provide these services.

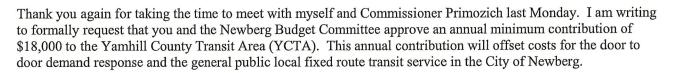

Dear Mr. Rhodes:



Newberg residents had over 20,000 trips on YCTA's Newberg local fixed route and demand response services in 2014-15 which did not include Route 44 (commuter service). YCTA provides over 5000 hours of local fixed route and dial-a-ride services annually in Newberg with an actual cost of over \$200,000. This does not include the commuter service that travels between McMinnville and Tigard with stops in Newberg. Your annual minimum contribution of \$18,000 leverages a considerable amount of service for Newberg residents and visitors. Every contribution no matter how small from local jurisdictions in Yamhill County helps offset costs and contributes toward required match funds when YCTA is seeking federal and state grant funds.

We are very pleased that Scott Essin will be serving on the YCTA Advisory Committee to represent the City of Newberg. As we mentioned in our meeting, YCTA received a Transportation Growth Management grant for a county-wide Transit Development Plan. This planning effort will provide an opportunity during the FY 2016-17 for Newberg leadership and residents to weigh in and provide valuable input regarding the future vision and goals for YCTA services. The YCTA Advisory Committee will serve as an oversight group for this important planning process and we look forward to working with you, Scott, and other city staff throughout the process.

We believe there is a strong need for public transportation services throughout Yamhill County and we hope you will decide to make this very important contribution to ensure YCTA can continue to provide services in Newberg and throughout the county.

Thank you in advance for your consideration of this request and we look forward to working with you and your team on the Transit Development Plan.

Newberg City Council,

Homeward Bound Pets has had a busy year! Our low cost spay/neuter clinic has been going full swing. We have had over 4,300 cats come through our clinic since we started in late 2011, with 2015 being our highest year with just under 1000 cats.

The city of Newberg had the 2nd highest number of cats coming through our clinic in 2015 with 157, which is the highest year Newberg has ever had. That works out to \$7,850 HBPets has spent on the cats from the City of Newberg to stop unwanted litters of kittens from being born in 2015.

We have seen a considerable decline of litters of kittens brought into our shelter this season. We normally would be at capacity by now with at least 12 litters in foster care or at the shelter; to date we have 5 litters of surrendered or abandoned kittens.

We would like to request \$2,000 from the City of Newberg. This will help offset a portion of the out of pocket expense we incurred having 157 of Newberg's cat coming through our clinic in 2015.

Next year we may have a way to keep the \$210,000 we have spent so far on our low cost spay/neuter clinic, in Yamhill County, rather than sending it to Wilsonville and Tigard. Keeping our paws crossed we will let you know more next year. Thank you for your time and consideration to our request.

Positions added to the Proposed Budget for 2016-17

- 1. <u>Information Officer (1 FTE)</u>: With a new city manager, the community visioning process will have the long-term staff leadership necessary to move it forward. The addition of a full-time Information Officer in the City Manager's Office will provide the specific resources to assist in execution and communication of the visioning program. The position will also be responsible for managing a communications plan to establish an outreach process to the community and a method to obtain feedback. Both of these projects are identified as Council Priorities.
- 2. <u>Systems Administrator (1 FTE)</u>: This position is needed to keep up with current workload as well as the projected technology initiatives planned to accomplish Council Priorities. Network design and equipment improvement are also included in this budget. An integral piece of the success of these efforts includes the addition of a Systems Administrator.
- 3. Accountant (.5 FTE): The budget includes additional staffing in the Finance Department which will increase a current .5 FTE into a full-time position. This position better aligns the core staff skills and resources with the needs of the department, allowing senior management to respond to city-wide issues, such as the development of a 5-year financial plan which is a Council Priority.
- 4. <u>HR Assistant (.5 FTE)</u>: The new part-time Human Resources Assistant will provide additional support to the HR Director. This addition in HR will allow creation of a streamlined, easily-accessible format for all human resources functions and processes. This staff increase will assure that the City can meet the challenges of implementing a professional centralized human resources program for an organization of our size. Most importantly this addition will allow HR to meet the Council Priority of creating a fully functional and operational HR function within 18 months to meet city-wide staffing goals as defined in a staffing plan.
- 5. <u>Assistant Planner (1 FTE)</u>: The Planning position will increase staff in the Planning Division to meet the need for implementation of the April 2016 adopted Newberg Economic Development Strategy for business retention, expansion and recruitment, along with coordination with the Chamber and Downtown Coalition and handle an increasing caseload for current (e.g. design review, subdivisions, partitions, code adjustments, variances) and long range planning (e.g. development code updates and master plans).
- 6. <u>Facilities and Grounds Maintenance Worker (1 FTE)</u>: The Maintenance position (primarily Public Works funds) is designed to reduce summer temporary help and provide greater efficiency and service on a year-round basis. A full time position will help to maintain City facilities properly and prevent an increasing backlog of unmet maintenance needs.
