Why this is As Oregon's state economic forecasts continue to decline, DEQ may need to fulfill its obligations as the state environmental protection regulatory

to fulfill its obligations as the state environmental protection regulatory authority with less funding from state general and lottery funds. The discussion will help the commission as it deliberates on the next version of strategic directions and evaluate opportunities for alternative models and

understanding of the economics of environmental protections when

evaluating DEQ's Strategic Directions update for 2012.

Background and other information

Robert Costanza joined the Portland State University Institute for Sustainable Solutions as director in September 2010. Prior to his work at PSU, Costanza was the Gund Professor of Ecological Economics and director of the Gund Institute for Ecological Economics at the University of Vermont from 2002 until 2010. He is internationally acclaimed for his visionary work across disciplines, linking ecology and economics to sustainability. In addition to his role as director of the Institute for

Sustainable Solutions, Costanza is a professor of sustainability at PSU.

Next steps EQC will meet in November 2010 for a special meeting and retreat focused

on the 2012 update to DEQ's Strategic Directions. The information and discussions shared during this, and other, items will help inform the commissioners about Oregonian's concerns and priority work for DEQ over the next six, 10 or 20 years. After the commission meets in November, DEQ will begin a process to draft and share its proposed

updates throughout 2011 for final EQC review and approval by late 2011.
