Hi Lisa. I also think this memo should technically go to me. The site assessment and NPL listing program, as well as the removal program, is in my Branch and I think that is technically the parts of the CERCLA program where the site was referred. We then made the decision to propose the site to the NPL in Sept 2024 and Kira is correct that it is still in the "proposed" not "final" status. We do not know at this point if or when it will be listed as final. I guess you could include both Kira and I to cover all parts of the CERCLA program if you would like. My understanding is that this was a State RCRA site and the EPA RCRA program really had no involvement. Should that be somehow noted in this

memo? I am also not aware of the June 10 "record of site transfer" referenced in the memo.

Dear Regional Administrator Sixkiller:

On behalf of the State of Oregon, I support the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's proposed listing of the J. H. Baxter site in Eugene to the National Priorities List.

The J.H. Baxter site, which was home to a wood treater starting in the early 1940s, has been of concern to the state for many years. The company has conducted treatment of a groundwater contamination plume at the site since 1994, and J.H. Baxter has been under a cleanup order from the Oregon Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) since 2019. DEQ discovered elevated levels of dioxins in the surrounding neighborhood in 2021, which widened the area of concern. The facility closed in January 2022, and DEQ requested assistance from EPA in March 2022 to help characterize the contamination both on the site and in the surrounding community. The involvement of your EPA Region 10 staff in helping characterize the contamination has improved our understanding of the impact of the site and made it clear that the resources available through an NPL listing are critical to a timely cleanup.

In addition to EPA and DEQ, there has been significant involvement from other state and local regulatory agencies, community organizations, and the general public. The level of public involvement and interest in this site has been high, particularly regarding the contamination in the residential neighborhood adjacent to the site and, in part, due to environmental justice concerns. DEQ has begun the first residential cleanups on some of the properties with the highest levels of dioxins, but much more work remains to be done to ensure the long-term public health of Oregonians living near the site. The level of resources, staff, and expertise that EPA can bring to bear on this site will be crucial in this effort.
