Discussion regarding parking prohibition on the southwest corner of the intersections at Hancock and College and Hancock and Main Street.

Problem was referred from the Traffic Safety Commission due to complaints of hazards created by turning movements at these intersections

The Committee recommends a survey be made of the entire length of Hancock Street to determine if other such hazards or impaired vision problems will necessitate prohibited parking elsewhere.

A letter from Santana Motors was read which requested a "No parking" area between driveways on the west side of Edwards Street in the 100 block adjacent to this property.

The Committee did not recommend prohibited parking in this area at this time. Santana Motors is to be notified of the Committee decision.

Regarding the proposed no parking on the south side of Sixth Street between Edwards and Meridian. This concerns one-half block only.

The traffic Safety Committee recommended this proposal and the Police Committee concurs. Ordinance to be drawn making Sixth Street a through Street between Blaine and River Streets. The traffic safety committee recommends and the Police Committee concurs. Ordinance to be drafted.

(This requires traffic control installation at the intersection of Meridian and Center Street at Sixth only.)

Making Eleventh Street a through Street between River and Chehalem Streets.

Recommended by the Traffic Safety Committee. Approved by the Police Committee.

It was further recommended that 15MPH speed sign be placed by Scott Leavitt Park .

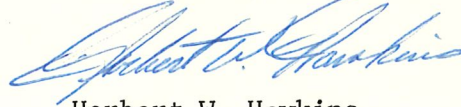
Police Department Budget: Fiscal year, 77-78.
