1. Approved recommendations to amend traffic ordinances:

1. Vehicles proceeding in a northerly direction on South Main Street shall come to a full stop before entering the intersection of Main Street and Fifth Street.

2. Parking of vehicles to be prohibited on E. Eleventh Street at its intersection with Pacific Street for a distance of 30 feet from the East curbline of Pacific Street easterly on both the northeast and southeast corners of said intersection.

3. Parking of vehicles to be prohibited on the south side of E. Twelfth Street for a distance of 55 feet west of the west curbline of Pacific Street.

4. Parking to be limited on that portion of E. Eleventh Street from curbline of River Street to curbline of Pacific Street to two hours Monday to Saturday inclusive between the hours of 8 A.M. to 5 P.M.

5. Parking of vehicles to be prohibited on S. Pacific Street from south curbline of E. Eleventh Street to north curbline of E. Twelfth St.

6. Parking of vehicles to be prohibited on the north side of E. Twelfth Street from east curbline of Columbia Street to west curbline of Pacific Street.

7. Parking of vehicles to be prohibited on the east side of S. Main Street for a distance of 35 feet southerly from the curbline of E. Fifth Street.

2. Approved recommendation to add position of Corporal Matron/Dispatcher to classified pay plan.

3. Disposition of older police vehicles discussed.

4. Chief advised that there are no new police vehicles readily available. Department of General Services of the State have not obtained new bids. Probably not available before October or November.

5. Sale of unclaimed bicycles, vehicles, and other equipment briefly discussed. Sale to be advertised as soon as all items are tabulated.

6. Garage sales, itinerant merchants and sale of merchandise on city sidewalks and streets discussed.

7. To recommend disposal/sale of all parking meters and removal of meter stands in the City.
