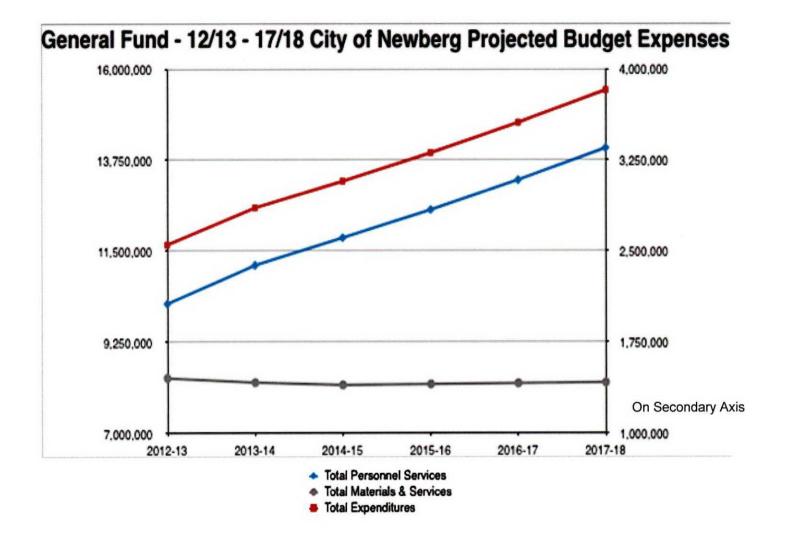

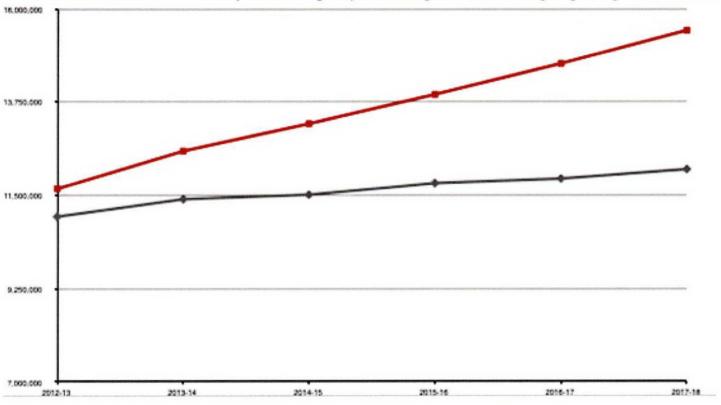

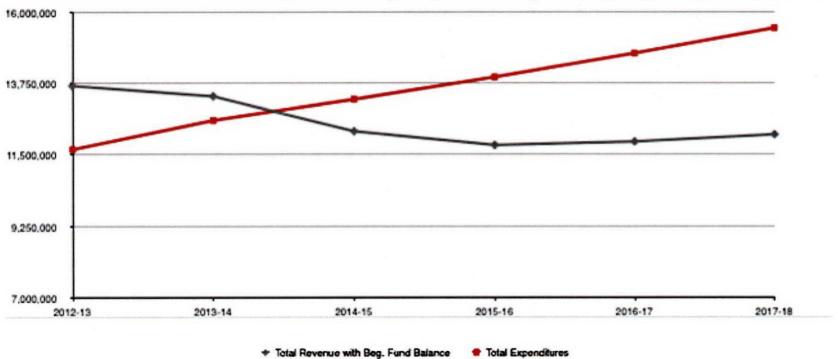
General Fund - 12/13 - 17/18 City of Newberg Projected Budget Without Using Beginning Fund Balance

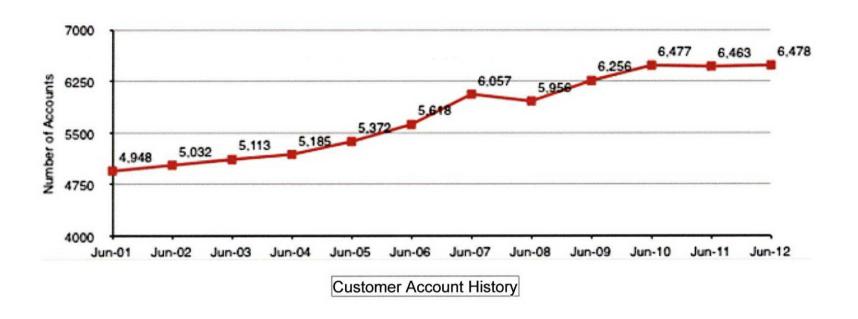

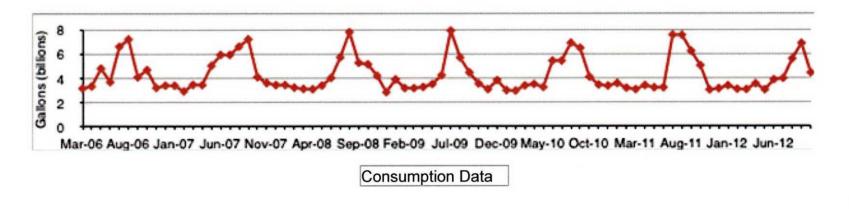

Utility Fund Observations

Slow Account Growth

- Slow revenue growth in Water, Wastewater and Stormwater
- Can growth keep up with personnel cost inflation

Reduced SDC revenue in Water and Wastewater

- Reduced ability to repay debt
- Burden shifts to rates until recovery

Union Negotiations not yet complete

Next Utility Rate Change - 2015

- Should Council consider pre-2015 adjustments?
- No change may trigger greater than 5% increases in 2015.
