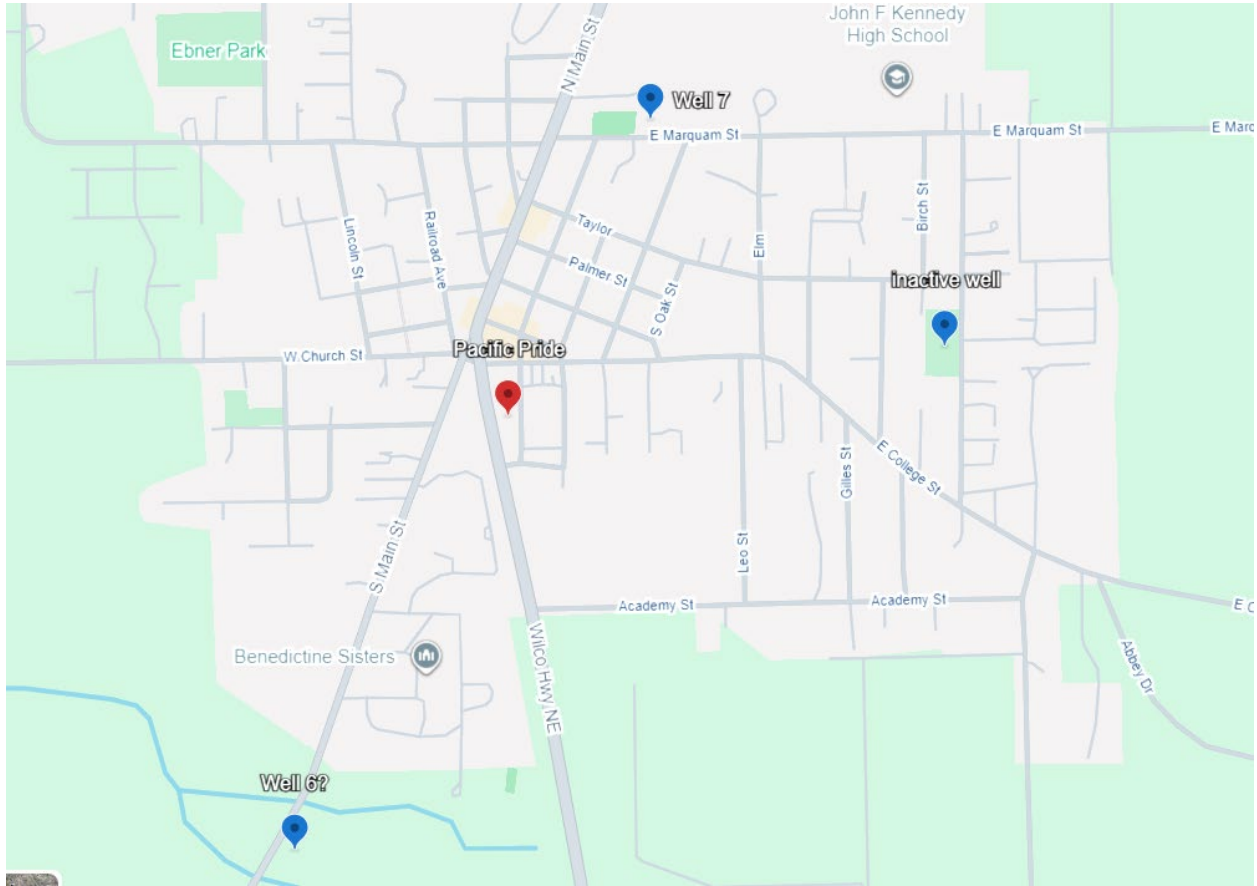

## City of Mt. Angel 2025 Annual Water Quality Report

### WATER QUALITY DATA FROM 2024

This is the annual Consumer Confidence Report (CCR) on the drinking water system. The required sample results have been gathered to inform customers about their tap water. With this information, we hope you will learn more about your water for future use.



### MONITORING

Monitoring is an important first step in making sure contaminants stay out of the City's water supply. Keeping track of current conditions, through monitoring, allows the assurance of a high-quality product, and a quick response to any changes that could potentially impact the water supply.

Consistent monitoring of the City's distribution system and monthly routine testing of the water at various sites throughout the distribution system helps ensure that a clean and safe product is being delivered to customers, and that all federal and state regulations are met.

### YOUR DRINKING WATER COMES FROM GROUNDWATER

Groundwater is water that exists beneath the earth's surface in rock and soil pore space. The City of Mt. Angel wells derive groundwater from the underlain Columbia River Basalt Aquifer. There are currently three wells: Well #5 is inactive and is located at Humpert Park on Alder Street. Well #6 is located just south of town on Mt. Angel Highway. Well #7 is located just west of the Middle School on E. Marquam Street.
