Ordinance No. 43.

An Ordinance to prohibit the giving or selling of intoxicating liquor or liquors to Common drunkards, to provide for the punishment therefor and to define what shall constitute a common drunkard.

The people of the City of Lebanon do ordain as follows:

Section 1.

That any person or persons who shall give, trade, sell or dispose of any whisky, brandy, wine rum, gin, beer or any other intoxicating liquor or liquors to any common drunkard, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor; and upon conviction thereof before the Recorder's Court shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$50⁰⁰ nor less than \$10⁰⁰ or by imprisonment in the City jail not less than five days nor more than twenty five days.

Section 2.

That a common drunkard, within the meaning of this Ordinance is defined to be "a person who drinks intoxicating liquor to excess and prolongs his drinking periods until he becomes or is likely to become a menace to the peace and morality of the City of Lebanon, Lin County, Oregon."

Section 3.

This Ordinance shall not apply to licensed and practicing physicians, when they, while in the lawful discharge of professional duties, prescribe or give intoxicating liquor to patients who are common drunkards.

Section 4.

This Ordinance shall be and remain in full force and effect from and after its

approval by the Mayor.
