

Ordinance No 23

Relating to the Repeal of Ordinance No 4, relating to granting of License for the sale of Spirituous and Malt Liquors, Also to Repeal Sections 17, 18 & 19 of Ordinance No 5 relating to the Assessment Levy and Collection of Town Taxes and the granting and Collection of Licenses and imposing and Collection of fines, Also relating to the Collection and granting of licenses and fines

The People of the Town of Lebanon Oregon do Ordain as follows

- Sec. 1 That Ordinance No 4 relating to granting of Licenses for the sale of Spirituous and Malt Liquors is hereby repealed
- Sec. 2 That Sections 17, 18, & 19 of Ordinance No 5 relating to the Assessment Levy and Collection of Town Taxes and the granting and Collection of fines are hereby repealed and the following enacted in lieu thereof in said Ordinance
- Sec. 3 That no person, firm, Company or Corporation shall be engaged in, prosecute or carry on any Trade, business or profession within the limit of the Town of Lebanon herein after mentioned and described until he, she, or they have obtained a license therefor in the manner herein after provided

Sec. 4

That any person firm, company or corporation required by this Ordinance to obtain license to engage in any trade, business or profession, for which a license is required by this Ordinance shall pay to the Town Treasurer such sum or sums as hereinafter provided there upon with the receipt of the Town Treasurer which receipt shall set forth the kind of business, for which license is ~~granted~~^{desired} they shall apply to the City Recorder who shall issue license to the parties applying in accordance with the receipt of the Treasurer

Sec. 5

That if any person or persons shall exercise or carry on any trade, business or profession ~~or do~~ any act herein after mentioned for the exercising or carrying on or doing of which trade business or profession a license is required by this Ordinance without taking out such license as in that behalf required he she or they shall on conviction before the Recorder for every such offence besides being liable to the payment of the license be subjected to imprisonment for a term not exceeding twenty days or a fine ~~of~~ not exceeding fifty dollars or both

Sec. 6

That in every license to be taken out under or by virtue of this Ordinance shall be contained and set forth the purpose trade or profession for which license is granted and the name with the place

of business of the person or persons taking out the same, if by a peddler whether authorized to trade on foot or with one or more animals the time for which said license is to run with the date or time of granting such license and any person carrying on or exercising any trade business or profession or doing any act for which a license is required shall on demand of any Town Officer produce such license and unless he ~~does~~ shall do so may be deemed and taken to have no license and to be arrested and brought before the Recorder and fined not less than Two Dollars nor more than five Dollars and costs for such refusal on demand so made, provided said party has a license and in case any person having a license and shall refuse to produce the same when demanded by any Town Officer said officer may secure the animal wagon and contents or pack bundle or basket of such person so refusing and hold the same until said license is produced and to apply the same to the payment of any fine and costs that may be adjudged for such refusal

Sec. 7 That in any case when more than one of the pursuits employments or occupations herein after described shall be pursued or carried on in the same place by the same person

or at different places at the same time license must be taken out for each according to the rate generally provided

Sec. 8 All licenses required by this Ordinance shall be paid in advance ~~in~~ Gold or Silver coin or in other legal currency of the United States and shall expire on the day manual for the expiration of said license

Sec. 9 Every person keeping a Bar Room or Drinking Shop shall pay an annual license of Three Hundred Dollars per annum or a Semiannual license of One Hundred and Fifty Dollars No license for keeping a Bar Room or Drinking Shop shall be granted for a less period than Six Months Every person who keeps Malt or Spirituous liquors or wines for sale at retail in less quantities than One gallon either as his sole business or in connection with some other occupation shall be deemed a keeper of a Bar Room or Drinking Shop under this Ordinance

Sec. 10 Peddlers on foot shall pay a weekly license of Two Dollars Peddlers with one horse Two Dollars and Fifty Cents and Peddlers with two horses Three Dollars Any person (excepting

All those peddling Newspapers Bibles Religious Tracts, Farmers from the Country peddling the products of the farm) who offers to sell at retail or wholesale goods Wares Merchandise or other Commodities Travelling from place to place in the Town of Lebanon shall be regarded as a peddler under this Ordinance

Sec. 11 Bowling Allys Billiard Tables and Pidgeon Hole Tables shall pay a quarterly license of Two Dollars and Fifty Cents per table per quarter

Sec. 12 Theaters shall pay two Dollars and Fifty Cents for each entertainment. Every building used for the purpose of Dramatic plays or performances or any public exhibitions what so ever where an admission fee is charged shall be deemed a theater under this Ordinance, provided that in case the net proceeds are to be wholly used for a public improvement, Literary Benevolent and charitable object within the Town no license shall be required

Sec. 13 The Proprietors of every circus shall pay Five Dollars for each day or nights performance

Sec. 14 That it shall be the duty of the Town Marshal to see that the

provisions of this Ordinance be
strictly enforced

Sec. 15. This Ordinance to be in full force
