

Ordinance No 25

Relating to Closing of Stores Shops
Groceries, Ballalleys, Billiard Rooms
or Tippling House or Saloon for the
purpose of Labour or Traffic, or any
place of amusement on Sunday,

Sec 1
The People of the Town of Lebanon
Oregon Do ordain as follows;
if any Person shall keep open any
Store Shop Grocery Ballalley Billiard
Room Tippling House or Saloon for
the Purpose of Labour or Traffic
or any Place of amusement on the
first Day of the Week commonly called
Sunday or the Lords Day, such
Person upon conviction thereof
Before the Recorder shall be Punished
By a fine not less than five nor more
than Fifty Dollars, Provided that
the above Provision shall not apply
to the Keepers of Drugstores Doctor
Shops undertakers Livery Stables
Barbers, Butchers, and Bakers and all
circumstances of necessity and mercy
may be Pleaded in Defence, which
shall be treated as questions of
fact for the court or jury
to determine
