

## Ordinance No 30

Relating to the granting of Licenses  
To Barrooms for the sale of Spirituous  
Malt & vinuous liquors and the repeal  
of Section nine (9) of Ordinance No 23  
relating the sale of Spirituous & malt liquors

The People of the Town of Lebanon  
Oregon do ordain as follows

see That section nine (9) of ordinance No 23  
relating to the sale of Spirituous & malt  
liquors is hereby repealed & the following  
enacted in lieu thereof

see Every Person keeping a bar room or  
drinking Shop within the corporate limits  
of the Town of Lebanon shall pay an annual  
licens of three hundred Dollars per annum  
or a semi annual licens of one hundred and  
fifty Dollars, no licens for keeping a bar room  
or drinking Shop shall be granted for a less  
period than six months, every person who  
keeps malt or spirituous liquors or wines for  
sale at retail in less quantities than one  
gallon either as his sole business or in connec-  
tion with some other occupation shall  
be deemed a keeper of a bar room or  
drinking Shop under this Ordinance

see § 3 Every person desiring licens for the sale  
of spirituous Malt & vinuous liquors under this  
ordinance shall make application to the  
Town council at a regular or special  
meeting called for that purpose

To gether with the receipt of the Town Treasurer for the a mount of said Licenz and shall allso present a bond duly executed to the Town of Lebanon in the penal sum of three hundred Dollars, with two or more sufficient sureties to be approved by the Town council, conditioned that he the applicant will keep an orderly house and that he will not either directly or indirectly allow or permit any unlawful gaming or gambling or riotous conduct in or about his house or premises, and that he will not open or permit to be opened his place of business or building for the purpose of traffic or a amusement on the first day of the week comonally called Sunday, that he will not give or sell or supply spiritous Malt or vinuous liquors to minors or habitual drunkards nor to any person at the time in a drunken or intoxicated condition nor to any person whom the town council may designate nor to any person in the habit of becoming drunk when a member of the family over the age of twenty one shall give a written notice not to give or sell liquors to said person in the habit of becoming drunk, on presentation of said application the receipt for the a mount of licenz and the sufficiency and approval of the bond herein required by the town council, the town council being further satisfied of the character and standing of said party desiring to keep a bar room for the sale of liquors as herein provided

shall order the Town recorder to issue  
licens to said party as provided for in  
the ordinance for granting & issuing  
licens,

sec 4 Should at any time during the time  
for which the licens is granted, to the  
party procuring the same as provided  
in the previous section, each or any  
of the conditions of the bond as therein  
provided be violated by the person  
giving said bond, he shall be liable  
to pay a fine of not less than fifty Dollars  
nor more than one hundred Dollars  
for any such violation, to be recovered  
in a civil action in recorders court  
for the Town of Lebanon, the Town  
of Lebanon being Plaintiff, and  
shall also be liable to be prosecuted  
in any court having jurisdiction  
for the amount of the bond so violated  
it shall also be the duty of the Town  
Council on complaint of any citizen  
of the town or upon its own knowledge  
and belief that any of the conditions of  
the bond herein referred to have been  
violated to thoroughly investigate the matter  
and if any of said conditions have been  
violated to order the annulling and cancellation  
of said licens and the forfeiture of all  
money paid for the same, and the party  
holding said licens shall be deemed  
and held the same as having no licens  
from the date of said order

Sec 3 It shall be the duty of the marshal  
to see that the provisions of this Ordinance  
are faithfully carried out

Sec 4 all Ordinances and parts of ordinances  
in conflict with this ordinance are  
hereby repealed

Sec 5 This ordinance to be in full  
force and effect from and after  
five days publication by Posting
