

Ordinance No. 38

An ordinance to prevent any and suppress gambling and gaming houses and all places wherein any game, in which chance exists, is played for any thing of value or for any representation of value: and to punish any person who engages in any such game or who aids or abets any such game, or who keeps any such house or place.

The people of the Town of Lebanon, Linn County, Oregon, do ordain as follows:

Section 1

No person or persons shall, within the corporate limits of the Town of Lebanon, open, set up or keep either, as owner, proprietor, keeper, manager, employer, employee, with or without hire, lessor or otherwise, any gaming or gambling house or any house or place wherein any banking or any other game or games are played with cards, dice, checks, buttons or any other device, for anything of value, whether the same be played for money, checks, credit or anything representing value.

Section 2

No person or persons shall in any house, room or place, within the corporate limits of the Town of Lebanon, engage in, play, at or in, or bet upon or in, or assist any game played with cards, dice, checks, buttons or any device, for anything of value whether the same be played for money, checks, credit or anything representing value.

Section 3

No person or persons shall, within the corporate limits of the Town of Lebanon, set up or keep, either as owner, proprietor, keeper, manager, employee, with or without hire, lessor or otherwise

any kind of gambling table or gambling device, adapted, devised, designed or used for the purpose of playing or having played any game of chance for money, property, checks, credits or any representative of value.

Section 4

No person or persons shall, within the corporate limits of the Town of Lebanon, open, set up or keep any house, shop or place, resorted to for the purpose of gambling, or permit ^{or suffer} any person or persons to play at any game for anything of value, whether the same be played for money, checks, credit or any representative of value, in any house, shop or place under his control or care.

Section 5

Every person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof before the Recorder, be punished by a fine of not less than fifty dollars nor more than one hundred dollars; or, in default of the payment of such fine, by imprisonment in the Town Jail for a term not less than twenty-five days nor more than fifty days.

Section 6.

It is hereby made the duty of the Marshal to see that any violator of any of the provisions of this ordinance is at once arrested and duly brought before the Recorder.

Section 7

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 8.

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after six days after publication by posting as provided by ordinance.
