An Ordinance relating to the removal of dead animals from within the limits of the City of Lebanon.

The People of the City of Lebanon do ordain as follows:

Section 1

That any person or persons owning or having any animal of any description within the Corporate limits of the City of Lebanon, such as Cattle, hogs, horses, mules, sheep or dogs the same, or any of which shall die, the owner thereof, or the person in control or possession of which, shall at his own expense, cause the same to be at once removed so far beyond the Corporate limits of said City, that no foul or offensive smell or atmosphere will arise therefrom, so as to be in any wise offensive to any citizen or person within the limits of said City.

Sec 2

Any person or persons neglecting or refusing to comply with the provisions of Section (1) of this Ordinance, for the space of twenty-four hours after having been notified of the death of any such animal within the City limits, or after having personal knowledge thereof, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and committing a nuisance within the City limits, and upon conviction thereof before the Recorder's Court, shall be fined not less than ten (10) dollars nor more than twenty-five (25) dollars, or imprisoned in the City Jail not less than five (5) days, nor more than twelve (12) days.

Sec 3

It shall be the duty of the City Marshall, upon the neglect or refusal of any person to comply with requirements of this Ordinance, to cause the said dead animal to be removed, as in Section one of this ordinance, provided, and at once prosecute or file complaint with the

Recorded against such party so offending

Section 4

This Ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its approval by the Mayor
