

Ordinance No. 39.

An Ordinance to amend Section Two of Ordinance Bill No. 37, relating to granting of license for the sale of liquors.

The people of the Town of Lebanon do ordain as follows:—

That Section Two of Ordinance No. 37, shall be and is amended so as to read as follows, —

Sec. 1. Every person applying for a license to sell spiritous, malt, fermented or various liquors, in quantities less than one gallon, shall pay into the Treasury of the Town of Lebanon the sum of \$600⁰⁰ Dollars, in U. S. Gold Coin per annum, or \$300⁰⁰ Dollars semiannually in like Gold Coin, taking therefor the receipt in duplicate of the officer receiving the same. And every person, applying for a license to sell ale or beer in quantities less than one gallon shall pay into the Treasury of the Town of Lebanon the sum of \$300⁰⁰ Dollars in U. S. Gold Coin semiannually, taking therefor the receipt in duplicate of the officer receiving the same.

Sec 2 This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after five days publication by posting as provided by law.
