Gentlemen:

On June 16, 1972, you were issued "Short-term" Solid Waste Disposal Permit #95 to operate the Day Island Sanitary Landfill located off Day Island Road, Eugene, Oregon T17S, R3W, Section 33 Willamette Meridian. Our records indicate the site is owned and operated by Lane County as a sanitary landfill with daily cover of all wastes deposited.

Review of your operational plan and application have been completed and proposed permit provisions written. You are invited to review the attached permit provisions and submit any comments in writing to the Department of Environmental Quality within 14 days of the date of this letter. All comments received will be evaluated by this Department and final action on your application will be taken at the end of the 14 day review period.

Please note that the permit as proposed requires closure of this disposal site prior to November 1, 1974. In addition, the proposed permit requires installation of a groundwater monitoring well system prior to June 15, 1973 and submission of a final grading and closure plan prior to June 1, 1973.

It has been noted that certain chemical and oily waste materials have been accepted at the Day Island disposal site in the past. If you anticipate future acceptance of such materials, a plan for special handling and disposal of these wastes must be submitted to the Department and approved in writing subsequent to this permit.

The operational plan for the Day Island Sanitary Landfill is hereby approved, subject to the issuance of a solid waste disposal permit and confirmation by the Environmental Quality Commission. Approval of this plan must be and is conditional, dependent upon changing conditions and operation of the landfill in accordance with the plans submitted.

In view of these conditions, the Department reserves the right to stipulate conditions under which the landfill is operated and to require changes when circumstances so warrant.
