




What is the Climate Protection Program?

- Cornerstone of Oregon's carbon pollution reduction goals
- Places limits on climate pollution across multiple sectors
 - -Residential
 - -Commercial
 - -Industrial
 - -Transportation




Climate Protection Program goals

How the program works





- DEQ distributes compliance instruments to regulated companies
- Total number of compliance instruments = cap each year (except for 2025)
- Unused compliance instruments can be banked or traded
- Companies must have one instrument or community climate investment credit for each ton of emissions

How the program works: EITEs

- Emissions-intensive and trade-exposed industrial facilities
- Currently identified 37 facilities

EITE process

- Requesting information from sources as part of standalone CPP process
- Collecting and reviewing data provided through other air quality programs
- Data will inform a rulemaking to develop carbon intensity values and reduction schedules for these facilities




Community climate investments (CCIs)





Covered entities can earn CCI credits by contributing funds.

CCI entities implement projects in Oregon.



Equity Advisory Committee works with DEQ to ensure CCIs benefit Oregon's environmental justice communities.



Projects reduce GHGs in Oregon communities.

At least 15% of funds must be used for projects that benefit Tribes and Tribal communities.



Community climate investment priorities

- Promote public health, environmental, and economic benefits for environmental justice communities
- Accelerate the transition to clean energy particularly in or near environmental justice communities
- Reduce other air pollutants, particularly in or near environmental justice communities
- Reduce greenhouse gas emissions on average at least one ton per CCI credit







What projects can be supported by these funds?

Actions that reduce greenhouse gas emissions from:

- Transportation of people or freight
- Residential buildings
- Industrial processes or facilities
- Commercial buildings







How are these funds used?



- Administering CCI funds and projects
- Project implementation
- Capacity building











Fee for CCI entity

- Approved by 2023 legislature and adopted in last year's rulemaking
- Collected from approved CCI entities twice annually
- Up to 4.5% of all contributions in that timeframe
- Supports DEQ's oversight, including auditing and regular reporting on program goals

Committee member experience

DEQ must prioritize convening an equity advisory committee that represents multiple areas of expertise, interest, or lived experience in the following areas:

- Environmental justice
- Impacts of climate change on communities in Oregon
- Impacts of air contamination on communities in Oregon; and
- GHG reductions, including in the transportation, residential, and commercial sectors, and climate change.

DEQ must also appoint at least one committee member that represents a federally recognized Tribe or Tribal interests.

 - Requests for DEQ approval of work plans
 - Other submittals by CCI entities that require DEQ review
- Outreach to environmental justice communities
- Future advisory committee member selection

Application to be a CCI entity

- 501(c)(3) organization eligible to do work in Oregon
 - Subcontractors do no need to be non-profits
- Demonstrate experience, capacity, systems, and controls
- Demonstrate approach to implementing projects and calculating reductions of greenhouse gases and co-pollutants
- Demonstrate approach to engaging communities
