

RESOLUTION NO. 2661

A RESOLUTION APPROVING AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND CONSERVATION AND DEVELOPMENT FOR A COMMUNITY GREEN INFRASTRUCTURE MASTER PLAN PROGRAM GRANT.

THE TROUTDALE CITY COUNCIL FINDS AS FOLLOWS:

1. That the Oregon Legislature has determined that support and improvement of the natural environment for native seeds, plants and trees through water conservation, water protection, or ecosystem restoration is a matter of statewide concern and provides social benefits for current and future generations.
2. That green infrastructure supports improved water quality through the reuse of stormwater and uses rain gardens, infiltration planters, trees, tree boxes, bioswales, or other green infrastructure strategies to protect or restore natural landscapes as well as promote a healthy tree canopy which provides shade, sheltering wildlife, regulating temperatures, intercepting rainfall, and contributing to air purification by absorbing carbon dioxide and releasing oxygen through photosynthesis.
3. That the Department of Land Conservation and Development (“DLCD”), administers the Community Green Infrastructure Grant Program to, through local participants, implement green infrastructure master plans; and carry out community green infrastructure projects that provide direct social, environmental, and economic benefits to communities throughout Oregon.
4. That DLCD approved the City’s \$100,000 2025 Community Green Infrastructure Master Plan Program grant application for an Urban Forestry Management Plan, and awarded grant funds in full, subject City Council approval, requiring no local matching funds.
5. That the Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS) 190.110 provides the necessary authority for the City and DLCD to enter into an intergovernmental agreement (IGA) for the Community Green Infrastructure grant program.
6. That an IGA is necessary to implement the approved Community Green Infrastructure grant, and the City and the DLCD desire to enter into the IGA, which will

serve a valuable, necessary and authorized public purpose, and that doing so is in the best interest of the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TROUTDALE:

Section 1. Agrees now that the City enter into the 2025 Community Green Infrastructure Program Grant Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) with State of Oregon, Department of Land Conservation and Development (“DLCD”), and approves the IGA in substantial conformity with Exhibit A of the Staff Report, but with any changes the City Official may determine necessary.

Section 2. Community Development Director Erika Palmer is hereby designated as the City Grant Project Manager for this 2025 Community Green Infrastructure Program Grant No. CGI-25-2076.

Section 3. The City Council finds that in accordance with the authority granted in Oregon Revised Statute (ORS) 190.110 entering into an IGA with DLCD to develop a City Urban Forestry Management Plan, review and update the applicable sections of the Troutdale Municipal Code, and develop a community oriented street tree manual for tree planting, protection, removal and maintenance, and doing so serves a valuable, necessary, and authorized public purpose and is in the public interest.

Section 4. The City Manager Ray Young, and Finance Director Erich Mueller, (each an "City Official") are designated, or a designee of the City Official, to act on behalf of the City, and without further action by the City Council, the City Official is hereby authorized, empowered and directed to sign the IGA on behalf of the City, and any and all other required and necessary documents to implement the intent of the IGA and this resolution.

Section 5. The City Official is hereby authorized to execute, acknowledge, and deliver the IGA, including any other supporting and implementing documents, and to take any other action as may be advisable, convenient, necessary, or appropriate to give full force and effect to the terms and intent of the IGA and this resolution, and the execution thereof by any such City Official shall be conclusive as to such determination.

Section 6. Further, consistent with intent of the IGA, and in the best interest of the City, the City Official is authorized to determine, execute, acknowledge, and deliver any subsequent addendums, extensions, revisions, modification, or successor documents of the IGA, and the execution thereof by any such City Official shall be conclusive as to such determination.

Section 7. Further, as applicable, to comply with State statutes, administrative rules or local ordinances, and to act in the best interest of the City, and without further action by the City Council, the City Officials are hereby authorized, directed, and responsible for fulfilling the ministerial, intergovernmental, technical, compliance, procedural or promotional functions as required for the effective administration and implementation of the IGA and this resolution, and to take any other action as may be advisable, convenient, necessary, or appropriate, and the execution thereof by any such City Official shall be conclusive as to such determination.

Section 8. The Finance Director is authorized to disburse funds, subject to annual appropriations, as necessary to fulfill the IGA obligations and the intent of this resolution and is further directed to implement all such actions necessary to ensure budgetary compliance.

Section 9. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption.
