SUBJECT Five Tribe review of "Basin K1 Bioinfiltration Basin Annual Report, Kinder Morgan Port

of Portland Terminal 4 Slip 3," dated September 30, 2025

This memorandum, submitted on behalf of the Five Tribes, <sup>1</sup> reviews the *Basin K1 Bioinfiltration Basin Annual Report, Kinder Morgan Port of Portland Terminal 4 Slip 3* prepared by Maul Foster & Alongi, Inc. on behalf of Kinder Morgan Bulk Terminals, Inc. (Maul Foster & Alongi 2025). We also reviewed DEQ's draft comments on the report (DEQ 2025).

## Comment

We share the concern raised by DEQ's Specific Comment #1, that elevated pH may make it inappropriate to discharge stormwater to the Willamette River. We would add that total dissolved solids (TDS), due primarily to sodium, will also be elevated and may locally exceed the applicable stream standard of 100 milligrams per liter. Infiltrated stormwater will travel through groundwater, eventually reaching the River, without appreciable attenuation of TDS. Therefore, we recommend that both the pH and specific conductance of the stormwater be measured in order to evaluate these characteristics and determine whether the stormwater is suitable for discharge.
