A RESOLUTION INCORPORATING CHANGES IN CITY POPULATION PROJECTIONS AND CAPITAL PROJECT COST ESTIMATES, AND MODIFYING CERTAIN CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS, LISTED IN PREVIOUSLY APPROVED CITY TRANSPORTATION, WATER SERVICE, AND SANITARY SEWER PLAN UPDATES, AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City recently adopted updates to its Transportation, Water Service, and Sanitary Sewer Plans through inclusion in Ordinance No. 91-922, the City Comprehensive Plan, and

WHEREAS, these updates were based on revisions to public facility plans conducted between 1988 and 1990, and

WHEREAS, the City population growth projections contained in the updates are no longer current, as local growth rates have greatly accelerated over the last 18 months, and

WHEREAS, the cost estimates for capital improvements included in the updates were calculated between 1988 and 1990 and need to be corrected to 1991 values based on the recently adopted City Capital Improvement Program Priorities list, and

WHEREAS, certain capital improvements listed in the update have now been completed, while other improvements have been modified, and

WHEREAS, all the aforementioned revisions and modifications should be incorporated into the updates in the interest of consistency and accuracy, and none represent a change to City Transportation, Sanitary Sewer, or Water Service policies.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Revisions: Revisions to population projections, cost estimates, and project lists are hereby made to the City's Transportation, Sanitary Sewer, and Water Service Plan Updates, and said revised Updates are attached hereto as Exhibits "A', "B", and "C".

Section 2. Effective Date: This Resolution shall be effective on July 1, 1991.
