## RESOLUTION NO. 298

WHEREAS, the City Council finds due to contamination, one of the city wells, which heretofore has been the source of approximately $26 \%$ of the city water supply, has been disconnected from the city water system indefinitely, if not permanently; and

WHEREAS, the council further finds that drilling and development of the proposed new city well is not estimated to be completed prior to December, 1984; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to conserve the city's water supplies during the summer and fall months to assure a supply adequate to meet basic domestic needs of the peóple of the city; and

WHEREAS, by reason of the foregoing facts, the city council finds that a water shortage exists or will exist if use is not restricted,

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, DECLARED, AND ORDERED AS FOLLOWS:

1. A water shortage is hereby declared to exist and the following use restrictions provided by Section 7A of Ordinance No. 514 shall become effective July 12, 1984, and continue in effect until termination by resolution of the council declaring the water shortage to no longer exist:
(i) Water service users with even street address numbers will irrigate only on even-numbered days of the month, and water service users with odd numbered street addresses shall irrigate only on odd numbered days of the calendar month.
(ii) Lawn, landscape, and garden irrigation will be limited to the following hours: from $6 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}$. to $10 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m} . ;$ and from $5 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$. to 10 p.m.
2. The city recorder is directed to cause notice of the imposition of the emergency use restrictions by posting in three conspicuous public places and by publication in one issue of a newspaper locally circulated. The notice shall specify therein the restrictions, the provision for variance application provided by Section 7A(c) of Ordinance No. 514 and the sanctions that may be imposed under Section 7A(d) of Ordinance No. 514.


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
